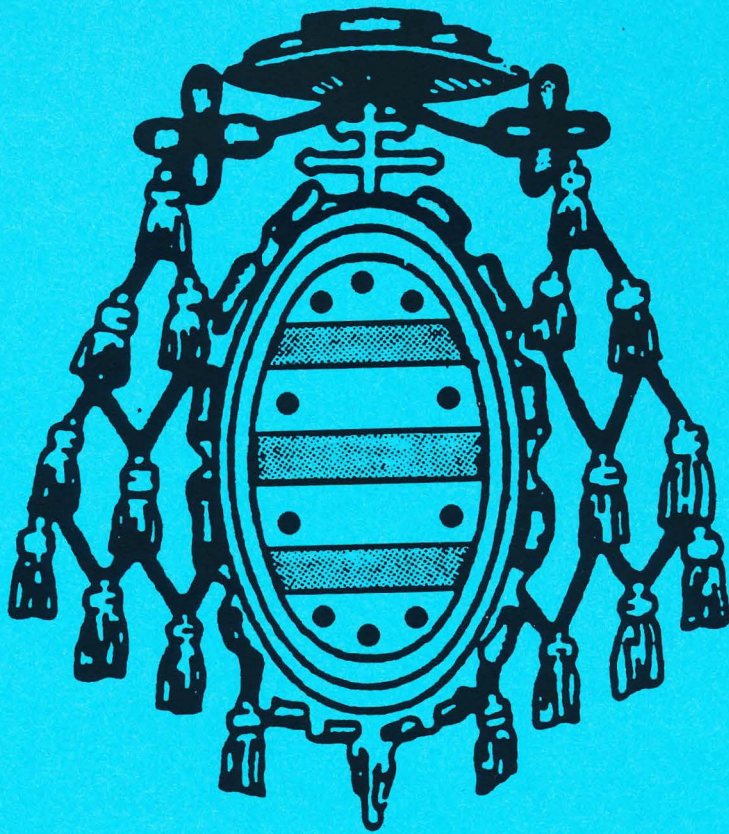

AEGEE-MADRID

Is Europe forgetting Latin America?

With the same mind of that of two years ago, when we organized the 'Jornadas Europa Latinoamerica', and taking into account the events that have been rapidly taking place in Europe, AEGEE Madrid wants to propose a global reflection concerning this matter by means a Conference that will be celebrated in Madrid the next 23rd, 24th and 25th of April.

In spite of their having been the purpose of many debates in different occasions, the relations between Europe and Latin America are seen now under new perspectives. The opening of the Eastern countries, the advancement in the process of a European Union etc. will be key points when considering once more this reflection. What is the future of the relations between both continents? to what extent is the new situation of the Eastern countries going to be influenced? what is the role of Portugal and Spain, countries that are in between these situations?

These questions and many others lead us to think about a new approach to the facts: an approach that does not imply a total of exhaustive view, we haven't got enough historic perspective yet, but an approach that tries to be as clarifying and useful as possible for our purpose. All we would like is an analysis of a situation which affects us directly, as far as we are both European and connected to Latin America. That is why we have invited a good number of approved persons to participate in Panneldiscussions and Lectures, so that our goal can be possibly achieved.

Concerning the subjects we will review in our Conference, we have chosen those that we consider most interesting, according to their present importance and significance.

These subjects are:
*Europe and Latin American Foreign Debt.

*Latinamericans in Europe: The Immigration Problem.

*Cultural Exchange

*European Cooperation and Latin American Development.

We hope that our Conference can be an autentic "forum" for debate about so many interesting matters, and we expect the cooperation of all Antennae as well as your active participation. We are waiting for you, once more, in Madrid.

4) PARTICIPANTS

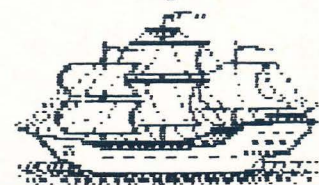
We wish to make our questions extensive to the greatest possible number of students, so, in spite of the difficulties this implies we would like to include 250 European students, and the same number of students from Madrid).

END OF THE CONFERENCE

Minutes of the East-West Working

Present members:

Minutes:

1. Opening of the first EWWG meeting with participation of Eastern European students coming from GDR, CSR, Hungary. The meeting takes place after the congress of AEGEE-Bonn "Fortress Europe" that was attended by about 200 EC- and 40 Eastern European students coming from 12 different countries.

2. Achim and Marielle informed about the EC-Phare-program which started this year. It support students exchanges between the universities of the EC and Poland / Hungary. There is already a budget but no specific program up to now. This may be a good chance for AEGEE to get money for the EWWG-projects. Achim and Marielle will keep themselves and the WG informed.

3. Rainer Obliker (Freiburg) proposes an AEGEE-stage-exchange-program for Eastern European students in the EC. Achim: this was even not possible for EC internal stages; should not be tried for Eastern European students. Rainer would like to try nevertheless and intends to develop a concept for the Agora. This was approved by the EWWG 12 (in favour) -5 (abstention) -0 (against).

4. Next EW events:

Leiden (7 to 9. 3.): Cultural Differences within Organizations in Western and Eastern Europe.
Berlin (10 to 13. 5.): the German Question.
Freundenberg (15 to 19. 10.): Network East-West (seminar in

cooperation with the Ebert-Stiftung for 30 participants; contact Christian Scherf, Huegelstr. 119, D-6000 Frankfurt, 49 69 512213).
Munich (19 to 23. 11.): Political Future of Europe (two days seminar (19. 20.) and two days congress (22. 23.) dealing with political and economic problems of East-West co-operation. Enschede / Osnabrueck and Barcelona would like to organize also EW-congresses in October, November. They agreed to co-ordinate time and subject with Munich.

These projects show the growing interest in EW affairs in AEGEE.

5. Definition of Eastern Contact Groups (ECGs).

a) The Agora of Salerno approved the proposal of the CD as formulated by the EWWG to establish ECGs in Eastern European countries. The status of ECG members within AEGEE seems to be controversial: Achim in the CD-letter and the WG meeting: ECG members have to be regarded as any non members of AEGEE (congress fees). Their name should be ECG-local (ECG-Warzawa).

Rainer S. presents a proposal (Annexed next page, 1st part) for the next Agora: ECG members have to be regarded as AEGEE-members concerning the admission for AEGEE events. (It would be impossible for them to pay a fee, this would mean their exclusion.) -they should be called AEGEE-local (ECG).

Achim: There is a responsibility towards all European countries (especially within the EC as Portugal and now even France). We should not forget them when we are giving privileges to Eastern European countries.

Rainer: The activities of the EWWG do not exclude activities in Western Europe: The Bonn congress was attended also by students from 8 Eastern European countries. With the sponsoring of two flights even one member of Athens and Barcelona could come.

The proposal (1st part) was approved by the WG 12-0-3.

b) Second part of the proposal (annex): ECGs will automatically become AEGEE contact groups after a democratic election in their country, was approved 9-5-0.

Achim: this fact is already included in the decision of the Salerno-Agora. Rainer: Should be clarified nevertheless. Achim does not want to propose this to the Agora to avoid long discussions and asks the WG to confirm his position. This was rejected by 5-0-9.

c) The payment of 1/4 of the membership fee (15 ECU) = 3.75 ECU per year by members of Eastern Antennas seems to be necessary for AEGEE-Europe (Achim) and difficult but possible for Eastern European students.

Nevertheless finances and Western currency will be the main problems of Western locals: without a special subvention it will not be possible to go to congresses.

6. After this discussion of technical questions which appeared rather strange for the participants from Western European universities practical questions were treated: What are the possibilities and problems of Eastern European groups?

- Michael (Dresden): no problem to get interested students in Eastern Europe but risk to become a travel agency. It should be clear that there has to be worked and organized as well.

AEGEE SHOULD AVOID TO MUCH BUREAUCRACY DEALING WITH EASTERN EUROPEAN STUDENTS (CAROLA LEIPZIG) AND NOT DISCUSS PROBLEMS OF MINOR IMPORTANCE. IT SHOULD BE OPEN-MINDED.

-Boris (Bratislava) confirms that also in Czechoslovakia there will be a great interest in AEGEE. It might even be possible to get own sponsoring. AIESEC already works in Bratislava.

-The same seems to be possible in Hungary.

Cyrus (Muenster): The ECGs should be mentioned in the address book of AEGEE. Rainer: We agreed with Adolfo on this point.

Achim: We would work in a

co-ordinated program in the East-West relations and not forget the other European countries. Rainer agrees but insists in the task of the EWVG to react to the exciting developments in Eastern European societies. Rainer: The Eastern European locals are not obliged to deal with subjects of (economic) Community affairs when they organize an event. It would be very interesting to have more discussions on problems as environment, culture, language, history, etc.

ANEX TO THE MINUTES OF THE EWVG MEETING IN BONN

Proposal for the Agora of Paris in order to clarify and develop the decision taken in Salerno concerning the creation of Eastern Contact Groups (ECGs) as approved by the EWVG:

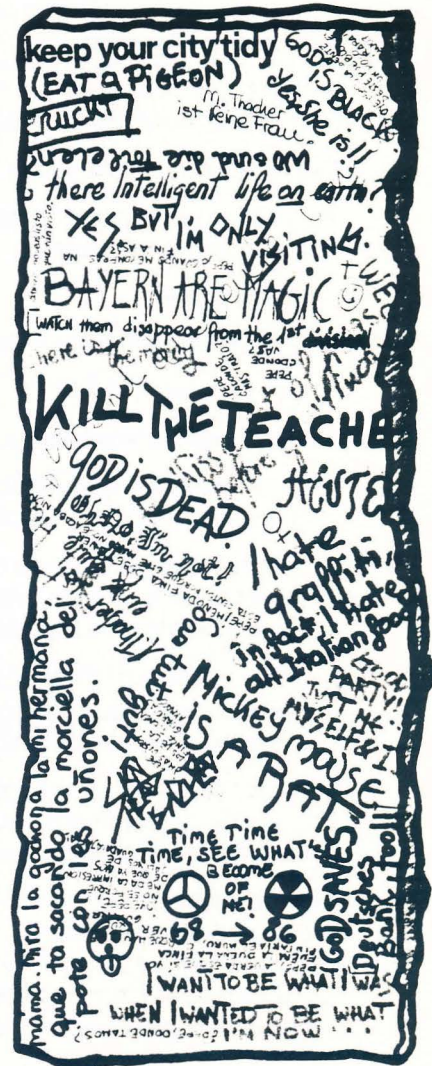
1. The Agora decided in Salerno to establish ECGs of AEGEE in Western European Countries. This decision aims on the creation of regular and organized contacts with students in these countries. This is only possible in co-operation with local groups having a special and exclusive link to the association AEGEE-Europe.

- They should therefore carry the name of AEGEE (AEGEE-Warzawa) (ECG).
- They should have access to every AEGEE event as any other member of an AEGEE-local.
- They should contribute to the activity to AEGEE-Europe by the organization of events and participation in

Working Groups.

2. The representatives of ECGs do not have the possibility to vote during Agoras or Presidents' Conferences. They will not become AEGEE-locals with the organization of an event.

After free and democratic elections in one of these countries the ECG concerned will become an AEGEE contact group with the possibility to change into an AEGEE-local after the organization of an event.

THE CONCEPTION OF THE AEGEE ENVIRONMENTAL WORKING GROUP (EnWG)

We all live in Europe, and we like to live here for the next decades. Therefore we need a well-balanced, natural environment and not a environment which is constantly in danger.

The members of the EnWG will make the European population aware of the environmental problems. It will be done in an AEGEE specific way:

- We will try to be a medium which informs the public by bringing together different groups and opinions. Therefore we will stay independent and neutral, but will communicate with all social groups and parties.
- Until now there are only a few efforts of environmental protection on a European level. So our focal point will be to support European environmental policy by analysing and observing the interaction of European environmental efforts and regional problems.

In order to work on such a project some basic ideas of how to start are needed. Even somebody who has no knowledge about these complex problems has to be able to begin at once.

In the following these ideas are presented:

To inform us and the public about the interaction of environmental matters three levels have to be inspected:

- the regional
- the national and
- the European level

Furthermore the work in the EnWG should be split up into the following steps:

1. Every single group will adapt one specific environmental problem, collect all available information about it and observe the development.
2. Each group will analyse the interaction between the regional, the national and the European level in relation to their chosen environmental problem. Regions have to be found which deal exemplary with the chosen problem.
3. After collecting information on specific examples of environmental policy, the groups will exchange and summarize their gathered information and distribute it amongst the AEGEE members as well as amongst the public.
4. A congress will be organized where all groups provide a store of information about their specific environmental subject, present their observations and results and talk about the evaluation of already existing adequate policies.

As has been shown in other areas of environmental policy, the intervention of the public can change things - this is particularly true in the field of environmental protection. It will be the duty of the EnWG to stimulate and activate the public opinion on European environmental policy. Imagine for example a valid European law containing the most progressive achievements of the single countries!

Four Weeks Environment for Lunch

Or: from environmental week to environmental month

The idea of the environmental week was to show the people from all over Europe how far it has gone wrong with our environment. The members of the Enschede environmental working group wondered to which extent the University of Twente worked in the field of environment. They contacted CSTM (Centre for Clean Technology and Environmental policy) and with their help they found people who were willing to explain the research of their faculty in the environment, so the next partner was found. For the European aspect an excursion in co-operation with Muenster has been added.

MONDAY

The first lecture was given by Prof. Bressers. He explained the work of CSTM was founded two years ago and it now gathered the different groups at the Twente University, which occupy themselves with environment. CSTM has sixty participants, mostly of chemical and management side. The level-headed co-operation between technics and policy results in a practical approach to the environmental problems. The next speaker, Mrs Schuddeboom talked what she has inquired into what is missing in the evaluation of the environmental policy. She noted e.g. there is no or not enough attention paid to the side effects.

TUESDAY

Dr. ing. Mulder explained the division-processes with the aid of membranes, what unfortunately from the point of view of the commercy isn't very attractive. After this lecture Ir. v.d. Beld talked about the biological cleaning of water.

WEDNESDAY

Prof. van Swaaij stated that there are two possibilities for the protection of our environment. First to prevent the expulsion of dangerous substances, second to remove this matters, preferably at the source.

THURSDAY

Besides the lectures of Ir. Valk and Ir. V.d. Meulen concerning heating over a certain distance, also an excursion to the modelproject Nordhorn-Povel (Est Germany) took place. The pollution of the soil isn't only caused by the textile-factory Povel, but also a refuse dump in the Thirties and pollutions in the river "Vecht" have spoilt the soil. It is unique to have such different kinds of pollution at such a relativ small place. The aim of the project is the development of an integrated workingmethod to be able to search for and to estimate the extent of pollution. Furtheron they tried to eliminate the polluting matters and then to come to an adequat re-use of the terrain. We were received at the town-hall and then we visited the terrain. Because of storm, wich certain umbrellas didn't survive, we could only visit the laboratory.

FRIDAY

Drs. Getteling explained the role of the media in the conduct of people. in the period '79-84' the attention of the newspapers for the environmental risks increased. Readers from newspapers, which published more about this search information on this subject. Also after a correction of political preferences, etc. this difference still remain. Drs. Kuyper talked about environment and education. In this moment only incidentally attention was paid to environment. There is need for co-operation between different organizations.

CONCLUSION

The environmental week could be called a success: every day there about 50 interested people, mostly not AEGEE-members.

Workshops also organized by the companies will offer the opportunity to have experience in teamwork in multinational teams by solving case studies in a group of five with different nationalities.

Lectures about the necessity of globalization and social problems of multinational teamwork and the presence of interrnational business schools will make the forum interesting for all European minded students.

The European Information MOBILITY AND ENGLISH BECOME

'Mobility and a good Knowledge of English language are becoming more and more and more important'. That was the message for students of Mr. C. J. M. Stutterheim one of the directors of CMG (Computer Management Group) and a speaker at the congress of AEGEE Enschede (in the Netherlands). The congress, concerning the developments of the information technology (IT)-market took place on the 11th and 12th January at the University of Twente and was in particular meant for students of computer- and business science from all over Europe.. Leading businessmen of the IT-world gave their view of what will happen in the future, hereby played the idea (1992) a very important role. Hot items were: the tendency of enterprises to have an European policy instead of a national one; the Japanese IT-industry and today's American market in comparison with the European market. About a hundred students attend the congress. Unfortunately, in spite of the information we have sent more then once, among them there were not so many foreign students, only one Spaniard and a number of Germans.

'Participation of universities in the European research programs together with IT-companies is important for the position of Europe, because of the competition with Japan and the United States. The main object of standards and open systems, based on fundamental scientific knowledge, provided by the universities. "This was said by the rector magnificus of the University of Twente J. di Smit at the opening of the congress. According to him the shortage of good IT-specialist will increase and therefore the universities must educate more students in this field of science. The already mentioned Stutterheim said about the situation of the today's IT-market: 'The competition between suppliers of IT, such as IBM and CMG, has increased and next to it the life-cycle of the products has decreased, because the users of IT are asking enterprises, seldom have an obvious IT-policy.

An United Europe will lead to lower costs/prices, standardization, less rules and more co-operation as well as competition. Stutterheim also had a message:

"Software-services are the engine, because the hardware is already sophisticated enough.' His opinion is that the problem always is communication. 'Soccer is a world wide success, since there is no need for 'communication'. Everybody knows the rules.

Technology Market **MORE AND MORE IMPORTANT**

Mr. H. Tardieu, director research and development (R&D) of the SEMA group in Paris, noted that the software market is very distributed. "There is for example no software-house which controls more than 1.7% of the market. The today's tendency is that more and more softwarehouses fuse. If software-houses aren't big enough, they couldn't survive 1992 or they have to specialize in service. A recent French research shows the majority of softwarehouses spends less than 1% on R&D. By Tardieu's account there must be spent much more money on research while the time has gone people invent software in the weekend and in the hobby-room. It is better first to have a good knowledge of the technical aspects and then to build up marketing-technics the more difficult it is to follow the developments, because things change faster and faster. In the past everybody, such as medical men, economists and mathematicians were engaged by CMG and then they were taught the technical aspects. Nowadays only people who have studied business- and computer science are engaged. because they already know a lot about the technical side. It is much easier to build up knowledge of the market than of the technical aspects.

Dr. J. Le Quement, a Frenchman working for the directorate of the European Commission in the field of information technology, discussed the European programs as ESPRIT is a co-operation-connection between companies and universities within the EC-countries. To give the European IT-industry new-possibilities it is necessary that the industry, the universities and research-centre co-operate closely.

Ir. L. Salvador, manager by Cap Sesa in Paris, characterized the eighties by 'small is beautiful', because 'big is beautiful' because the importance of the network will grow.

All speakers stressed the importance of the willingness to travel. Further on they really need Europeans instead of Dutch people, Italians, Greek and so on!

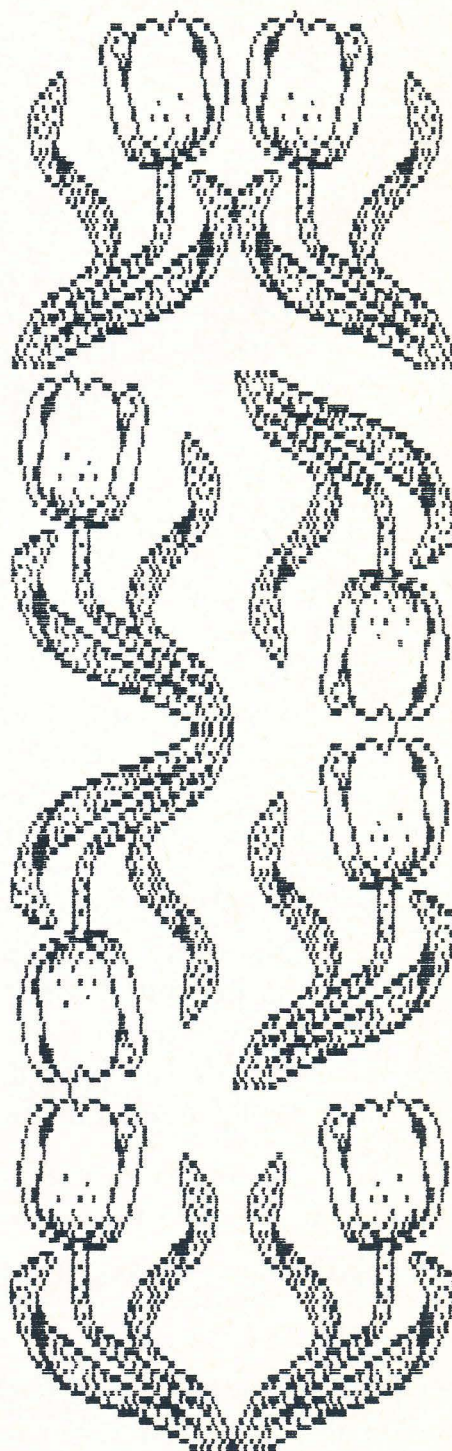

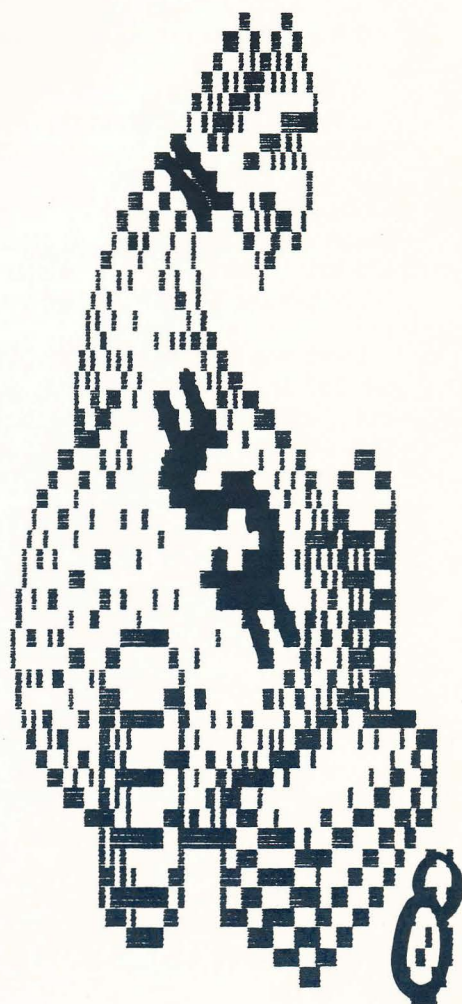

Happy new year and long life to Europe!

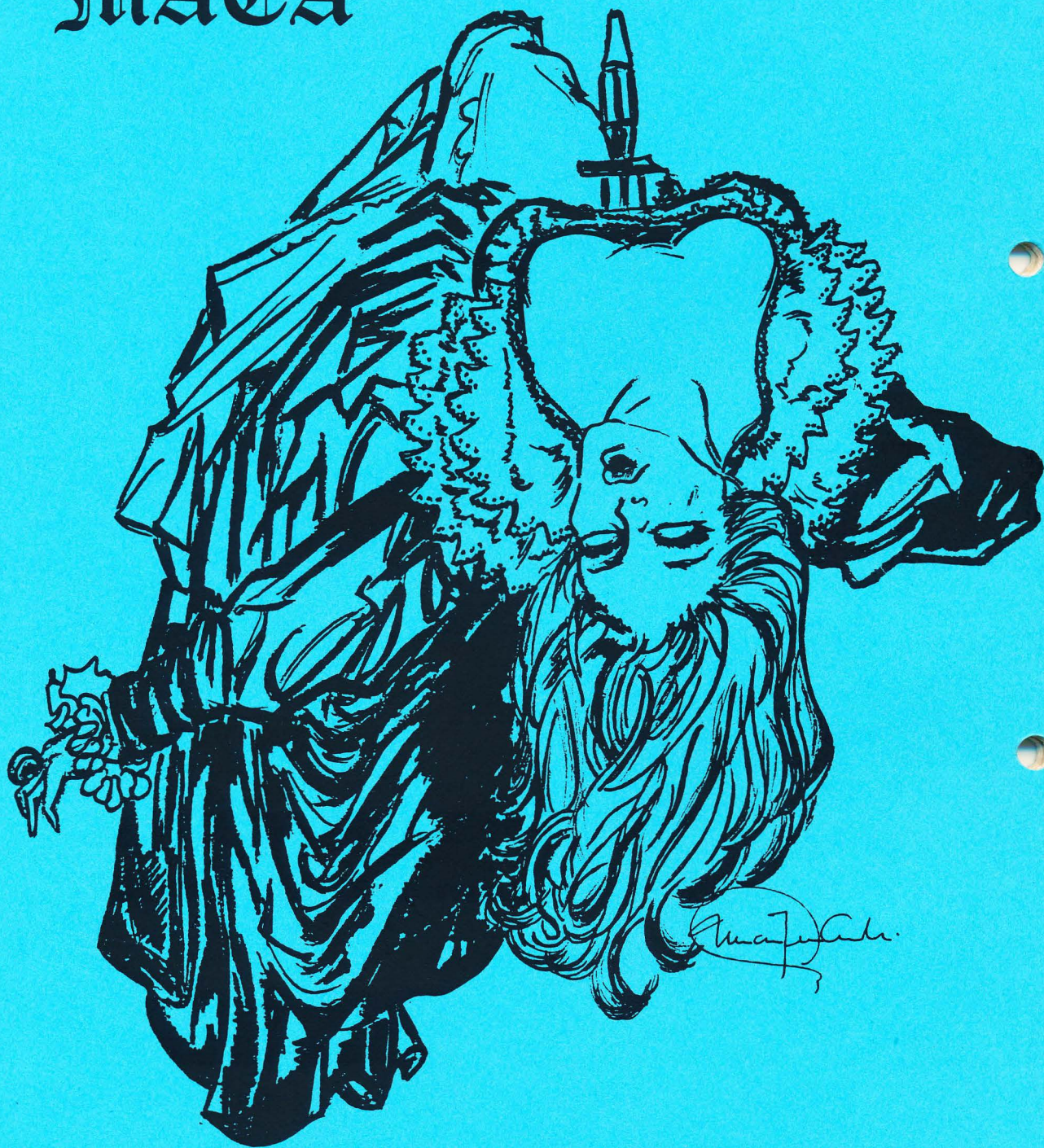
