

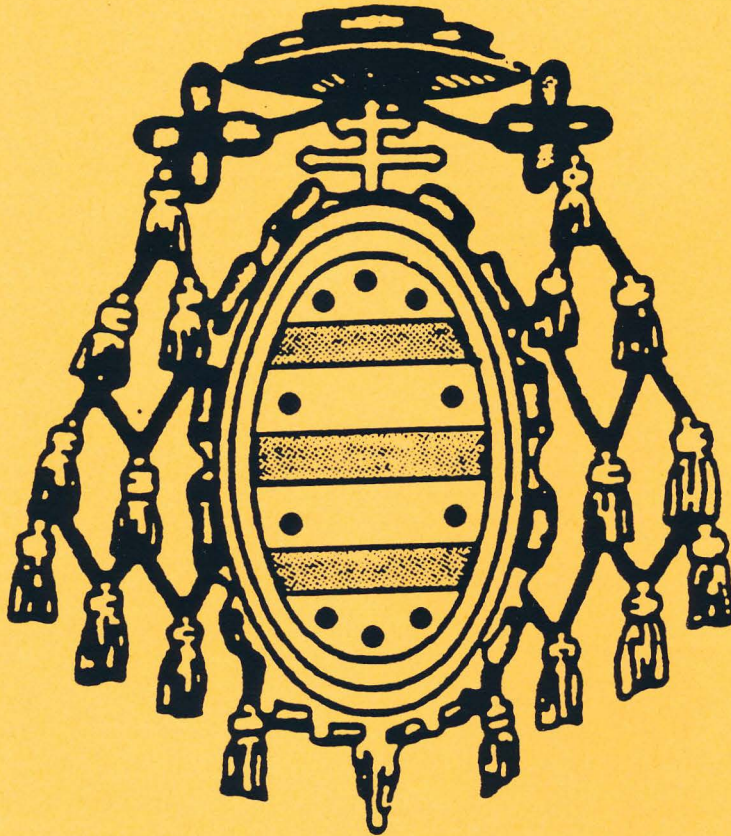

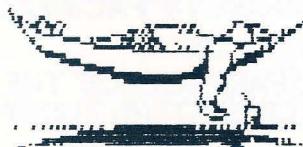

AEGEE-EUROPE and the ASSOCIATION OF FORMER RESPONSIBLES OF AEGEE-EUROPE have decided to organize together an event at the weekend of the 12th & 13th May 1990, celebrating the 5th anniversary of the foundation of AEGEE-Europe, within the framework of the Sixth Yearly Congress of AEGEE-Europe, EGEE VI - "Europe is always our time".

This event will reassemble, apart from the present responsables of the association, 150 members of the Association of former Responsibles of AEGEE-Europe (former members of the European CD, of Working Groups, of local Board of Directors), as well as 75 main personalities (European commissioners, ministers, deputies, European and national officials, counsellors, heads of enterprises, journalists, University rectors and professors), who have supported constantly the development of AEGEE-Europe since 1985.

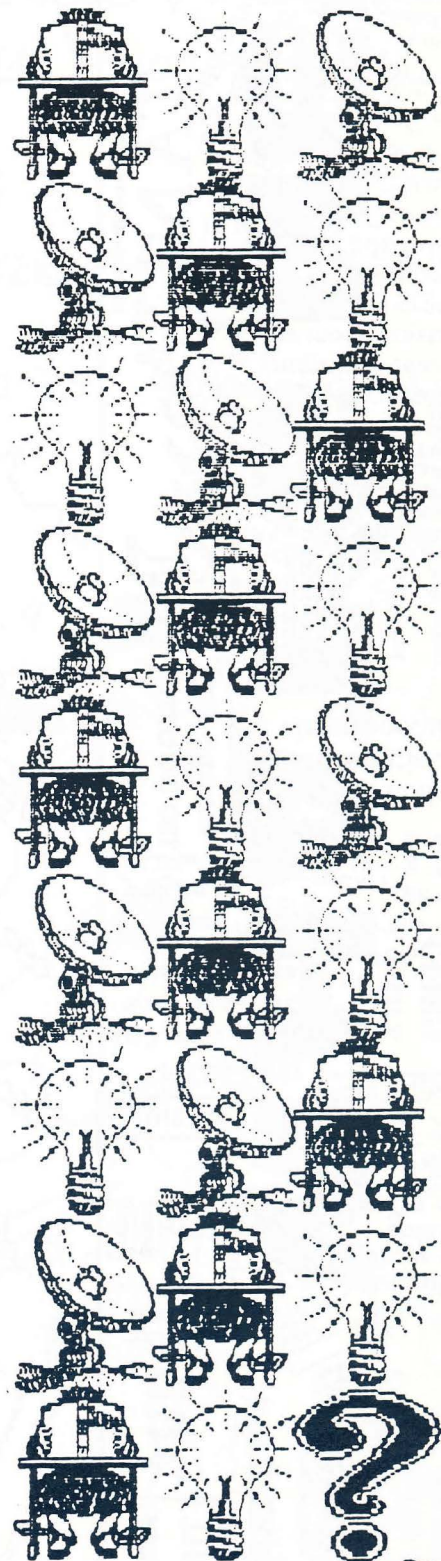
The structure of AEGEE is ideal to get prepared for Europe. AEGEE-Students are involved directly and personally in European thinking.

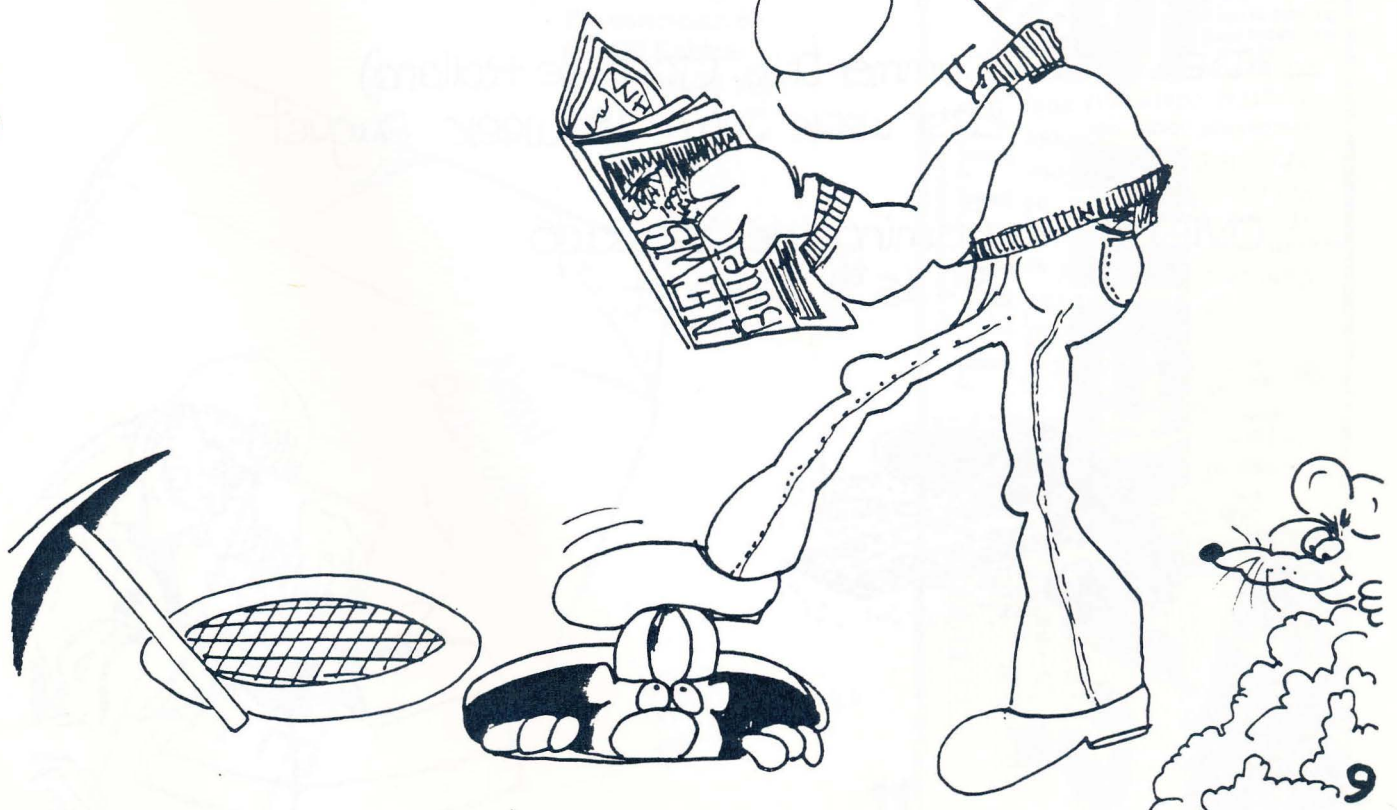

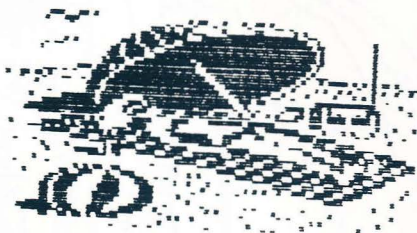

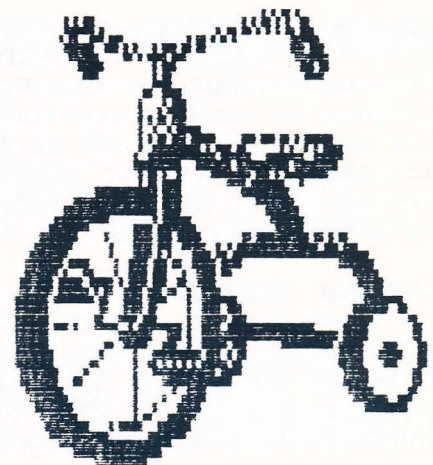
Summertrip 1990

A TWO WEEKS RUSSIAN SUMMER COURSE

What's this? Why Russian; the language of our most traditional "enemies"?
Of course I'll just answer to this not from myself fabricated question.

"AEGEE was founded to surmount barriers and borders, still existing between the European nations"

These words, from an advertising poster, have motivated us, from Leipzig, since January to participate on the activities of AEGEE.

For us this sentence doesn't mean to maintain friendly relations with only one European country but with ALL of them, including the Soviet Union. I'm sure this opinion is supported by most of the AEGEE-members.

At the congresses in Bonn and Amsterdam, a lot of students told us, that they are very interested in learning this exotical language. But mostly the courses at the universities (for example in Bonn) are so overcrowded the nobody has the chance to really learn! the practice to speak is missing completely. That's why we where asked if we could organize an event like a Russian Summer University in Leipzig. "Why not?" we said, and started to realize this project. Because there isn't a lot of time before the summer and the level shouldn't be lower than the AEGEE-standard!

Without doubt in the future more and more students will have the possibility one to travel to the Soviet Union, or to meet some Russian students at one of the AEGEE-congresses. But not only the touristical side of social contacts between western countries ant the USSR is developing, but in all the fields (culture, politics, economy,...) the relationship with the Russians is reaching a much higher level than before Gorbatschow.

Of course also the laguage obtains a new importance. And nobody can ignore this. So our decision to organize a Russian summer course is only a logical result of the development of the relations between East and West.

Another point for us is that already a lot of AEGEE locals are realizing a German course in the summer. You all could understand our intention as our new offer for education. whom could this do any harm? surely not the ideas of AEGEE!

And finally I want to promise all last sceptics:

Of course we will find the time in our event, to give also a lot of knowledge about Leipzid and the yet GDR. This might be also interesting for AEGEE-members.
