

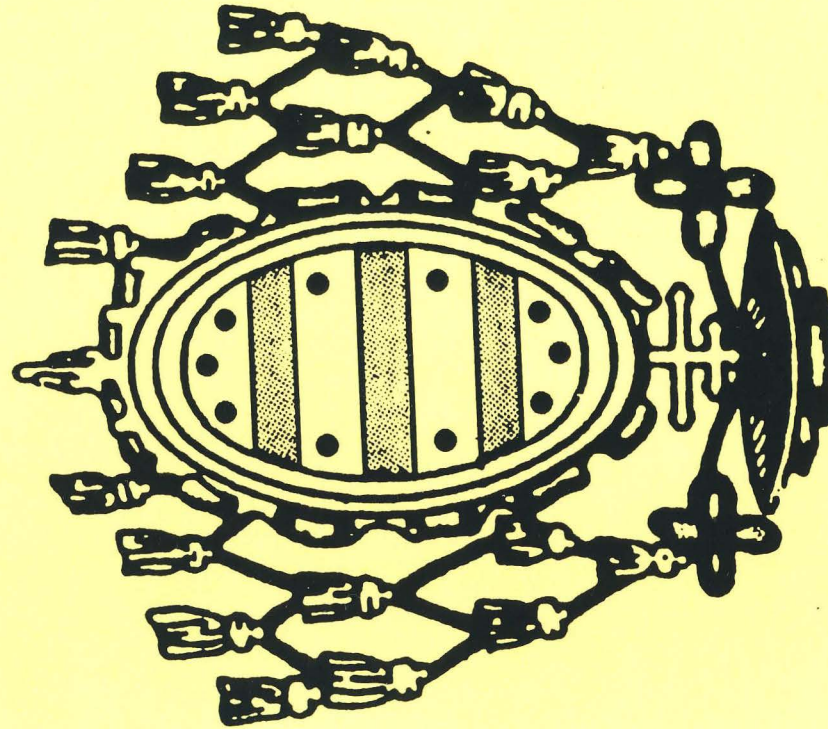

TEAM '90? What's that? Is it eatable?

Well, TEAM '90 is the biggest AEGEE-event that is still on the calendar of 1990!

Most of you will have heard about it and probably will have filled in the application form. But for the people who don't know about TEAM: here is the story:

Brussels 1988: EUROMANAGERS was organized by AEGEE-Europe. It was a big success, so in 1989 a new project was started: TEAM '90.

TEAM '90, The European Academic Manager, will take place in Milan, on 4-6th December 1990. But, what's TEAM?

TEAM is THE event where European students, multinational companies and top universities will meet each other.

The main goal is to prepare students for their future jobs in the ever-changing international world of business and industry, because there is a lack of European or even more global thinking people, who are able to work in lots of different cultures. It might be clear that if you want to achieve such thinking you'll have to work for it during your students' life. TEAM is THE opportunity to help you achieving this kind of thinking.

For 500 selected AEGEE-students there is the possibility to join the following program:

- Lectures about international management, teamwork, specialisation, etc.
- Workshops, organized by the participating companies.
- Excursions to Italian Companies.
- Personal interviews with representatives of the companies.
- Presentations of the companies and universities in stands and lectures.
- Parties, etc.

Also, four thousand other students are welcomed. The only difference is that they can't attend the excursions, workshops, and won't have free lodging and food. Interviews are open for everybody.

About the participating companies: At this moment we reached the maximum of five main sponsors. These are: Olivetti (Italy), Telefonica (Spain), Nielsen, Agip (Italy), and UAP (France). A large number of companies work at normal sponsor level. All kinds of companies, ranging from banks (Banco di Roma) to technical companies like Telefonica.

The organization of TEAM is in the hands of nine antennae, in cooperation with Il Sole 24 Ore, and under auspices of the Bocconi University of Milan.

There will also be a really fantastic social program. However, you may think that there won't be time for it.

Conclusion: Interesting companies, a congress about TEAM-work, lots of European students, parties, Milan, and perhaps a terrific job in the near future; what more can you wish for?

See you in Italy next December!

That is what this bilingual (English/French) competition in European Community law is all about. If you are a student with some knowledge of EC-law you are invited to participate. As a team of 3-4 students from your home university you will have to resolve a given case on a current legal problem. The case is elaborated by EC-law experts, in co-operation with the European Court of Justice.

### MEET

Moot Court gives you the unique opportunity to practice European law during your study.

You will get to meet European law experts and many students.

This is the way to make your first step towards your career in European affairs and to create a network of international contacts.

European lawyers of tomorrow need to get to know each other ...

### COMPETE

The competition consists of three parts:

1. a written elaboration of the given case;
2. an oral semifinal to defend the positions expressed in the written statement;
3. an oral final at the European Court of Justice.

Members of the team will be expected to argue the case of both the applicant and defendant.

The bilingual approach means that you will have to have general knowledge of both English and French. Native speakers will be judged in particular from their knowledge of the foreign language.

The judging will be done by an independent panel of outstanding professors and lawyers.

The winning team will be offered traineeships in lawfirms or institutes.

### TIME SCHEDULE

15 October: deadline application, until this date information will be available.

1 November: start elaboration of the given case.

30 November: written elaborations should be sent to the organisers.

13-18 February: semifinal at The Hague (International Court of Justice).

18-22 February: semifinal at Thessaloniki (Centre of International and European Economic Law).

14-15 March: final at the European Court of Justice.

### ORGANIZATION

Moot Court is organized by AEGEE-Utrecht and the European Law Moot Court Society.

The aim of the ELMC Society is to widen and increase experience in EC-law. The ELMC Society is a part of the AEGEE-family. AEGEE is a European student organization without party-political affiliation with more than 12000 members in about 70 European cities.

Dear Delegates,

Dear Members

enclosed we would like to send you three proposals, which are officially presented by AEGEE-Berlin, but in fact are worked out by the above mentioned persons. The proposals by no means cover all our current and structural difficulties. But the various proposed solutions are intended to work on strengthening the organisation from the bottom up and ensuring its steady growth.

We believe that, if we really want to overcome the structural difficulties, we have to create an information-flow system which does not lead to a concentration of tasks and power within the CD. Projects which could have a major effect on AEGEE-Europe (as the financial position) should under no circumstances be dedicated within the CD alone, but put to the AGORA. The time has come to think about new ways how our association can handle the coming advantages, how a real co-operation between CD and the antennae could be and how to come back to a working structure on European level.

We therefore have set up a CD-list (see page enclosed), not only to develop our ideas, but also to transpose them into the daily running of our association. (Our list will be presented (put to vote) at the AGORA in Bonn 23. - 25. 11. 90. )

We would appreciate it very much if we would receive any kind of reactions before the AGORA. Nevertheless we will send you our program called "Quo vadis AEGEE?" in about two weeks.

Let us work together, so that AEGEE continues to be an organization where the members throughout the network are engaged in developing and realizing different European initiatives.

Isn't this a unique advantage for our association?

### PROPOSAL

Concerning: the exchange of information about projects between  
the C.D. and antennae

Considering:

- \* That the C.D. should have a coordinating and supporting function.
- \* That the lack of information between the C.D. and the antennae hinders the cooperation between the C.D. and the antennae, but also the cooperation between the antennae themselves.

Convinced that:

- \* A better coordination and support by the C.D. will be facilitated by a structured informationflow between the C.D. and the antennae.

**AEGEE-Berlin** proposes:

- \* To structure the informationflow between the C.D. and the antennae concerning the organization of events.  
This will be done by the way of two questionlists.

The first list will be send to the antenna that has informed the C.D. about their plans to organize an event. The C.D. will use the information from this questionlist to:

1. see where the C.D. can help and support the antenna.
2. coordinate an eventual cooperation between antennae having similar plans.

The second list will be send to the antennae after the event has ended. The C.D. will use the information from this list to:

1. evaluate the event.
2. advise other antennae on organizational matters as well as on contents.

- \* To oblige every antenna to make the proceedings of their event. These proceedings will have to include the contents of the lectures and a short evaluation of the event. These proceedings will have to be send to the C.D., which will use it for the reasons mentioned above, namely:
  1. evaluation of the event.
  2. advising of other antennae on their future events.

And next to these for an other very important reason:

3. to present AEGEE-activities externally.

### PROPOSAL

Considering: An European Database

Considering:

- \* The lack of structured information about former AGEE-projects, on local as well as European level.
- \* That the CD should have a coordinating and supporting function.

Convinced that:

- \* Structured information about former projects can improve the quality of future projects, e.g. in view of organizational structure and contents.
- \* The organization of future projects can be greatly facilitated by structured information about former projects on the same subject.
- \* The existence of easy-accessible structured information about former projects will increase the use of this information.

AGEE-Berlin proposes:

- \* The foundation of an European Database, containing structured information about former AGEE-projects.  
This database will have to be managed by the CD.

This information will exist of;

- an outline of the contents.
- information about the organization, e.g. structure, eventual problems.
- information about the main sponsors and important contacts.
- a contactperson.

The contactperson can be asked to answer detailed questions which cannot be answered with the information in the database. Antennae wanting information can address the CD and the CD will then provide these antennae with the wanted information.

A possible means to provide the information needed for the database will be handed by the proposal on Exchange of information about projects between the CD and antennae.

### 1.) Opening by Georg

### 2.) Discussion about the coordination of the work of the group

First the question has been discussed how the list of members can be kept up to date. Some participants asked why they weren't on the list, although they were still interested in the work of this group. To prevent this it was decided that the future coordinator of the group should add on the minutes a declaration of membership every year which the members should send back to the coordinator, if they were still interested in the work of the group. But later it was decided to create an own task for this job.

Another topic long discussed was the question whether the work of coordination should be splitted up in national or regional groups. The majority was against this proposal as the thinking in national categories would be against the principals of AEGEE and not really helpfull to guarantee the flow of information inside the group. Instead of splitting the group into national parts it was preferred to divide the work to do and to distribute it to more persons (for the new created jobs see below).

Finally the problem was mentioned that too few people were in the group, which don't come from Holland or Germany. For solving this problem it was regarded as necessary that the EWWG should present itself on the next Agora and that a leaflet should be worked out, which will inform other members of AEGEE about the work of the EWWG.

#### 4.) Sowjet Union

The discussion about the status of students who want to become members of AEGEE in the Sowjet Union was very controversial.

It was proposed that it should be allowed to students in the Sowjet Union to found AEGEE-Antennas without any restrictions. But this proposal couldn't find a majority. The majority of the participants regarded it as necessary to hold on to the demand of free democratic elections in this country before any Antennas of AEGEE could be founded. The status of the antenna in Cluj (Romania) remained unclear.

The opinion that Russia weren't culturally a part of Europe could not find any support. The overwhelming majority of the members rejected this point of view and said according to the first proposal that - if foundations of full AEGEE-Antennas should not be possible right now - on the other hand contacts to the Sowjet Union were pleased and the foundation of "East-West-Contact-Groups" should be possible there.

This formulation found a big consent and therefore Michael Merker were asked to formulate a proposal which should be handed out to Armin Knab (General Secretary of AEGEE-Europe) to be presented to the next Agora.

The proposal to discuss about the status of Turkey was rejected.

Wolfgang Denkhaus from Munich gave informations about the forthcoming congress in Salzburg and Munich in November. He also explained the splitted structure of the academy in Salzburg and the following congress in Munich.

## 7.) East - West - Exchange - Program / Tempus - Program

Jörg Schieber gave a short presentation of the exchange-program. The present situation is very unsatisfactory, as no other antenna has even tried to support it. He proposed that every antenna should name a responsible person as a promotor of this program.

Afterwards he gave a short introduction in the tempus - program of the EC. Every antenna should read it carefully, as it might be possible to get some money for certain projects.

### 8.) Situation of AEGEE in the East-European countries

It was proposed, that the EWWG should coordinate a system of sponsorship. It should help interested East-European antennas to find an West-European antenna which could support their work, especially by material help like typewriters or computers. The majority criticized it as unrealistic because many western antennas also have financial problems. But nevertheless the members of the EWWG should initiate in their antennas the idea to search a sponsorship-antenna in East-Europe.

George von der Gablentz mentioned that for this his database might be helpful as he has stored many addresses there.

Achim Boers proposed to collect a catalogue of different measures, which could be a guideline for western antennas for supporting eastern antennas or contactgroups. The EWWG should do this in cooperation with the CD. The work for such a guideline was postponed for one of the next meetings.

### 9.) The relationship between the EWWG and the CD

To cut a long story short : Everybody regarded the relationship as very bad. Especially Marco Kahlbusch was criticized for doing everything alone. Nobody in the EWWG was informed what Marco has done so far. It was also regreted that Marco neither in Leipzig nor in Utrecht had been present. Nevertheless Georg as the speaker of the EWWG will make another attempt to get into contact with Marco and the rest of the CD for a better coordination.

Achim Boers presented the EWWG the minutes of the presidents-conference in Karlsruhe, in which severeral actions were listed up to be fulfilled by all European workinggroups. He mentioned that the statutes of AEGEE-Europe already demand it. For details please see the minutes of the meeting in Karlsruhe. One of ~~these~~ points was that all workinggroups must have a speaker and a treasurer and that these persons must be accepted by the CD. He promised that there would be no difficulties.

The most important things to be done are :

- The Agora must be given a moral report
- The news of the EWWG must be published in the AEGEE-Newsbulletin
- The EWWG-Bulletin must be sent to all antennas
- A presentation of the work of the EWWG must be worked out for a planned general presentation of AEGEE-Europe which the CD wants to edit

Georg promised to do this together with Marion van Kampen.

10.) Next meeting of the EWWG

Originally it was planned to have the next meeting of the EWWG in connection with the Agora in Bonn. But Achim Boers mentioned that maybe the Agora will be moved to Salamanca. Many participants protested against this possible decision of the CD.

But as it is still uncertain now where the next Agora will take place, the only solution which could be found is that Georg and the other boardmembers will inform all members of the EWWG by a circular. The general opinion was that the meeting should take place in Bonn provided that the Agora will also be in Bonn.

The latter half of the 1980s has witnessed a fundamental change in the Community's relations with the USSR and the other countries of Eastern Europe. Since the momentous developments of 1989, events have moved at an almost breath-taking speed. We therefore cannot stick anymore to the decisions as passed at the AGORA in Sevilla.

One of the cornerstones of our dealings with the Eastern European Countries should be the principle of "Specificity", i.e. treating each in accordance with its particular situation. Although the role of the USSR in a new European structure is not yet defined, we should start with the necessary dialogue in order to support the path towards democracy and market economy. We cannot wait any longer until these conditions as supposition are fulfilled.

We therefore would like to establish official contacts to university towns such as Riga and Kiev. This has to be done in a far-sighted way, in order to find students who stand up for the goals of our association.  
(The DATABASE of the East-West Working Group could be useful)  
Afterwards we could integrate them into our network of Eastern Contact Groups (ECG).

The establishment of Eastern Contact Groups should follow through a good co-ordination between the EWWG and the CD of AEGEE-Europe.

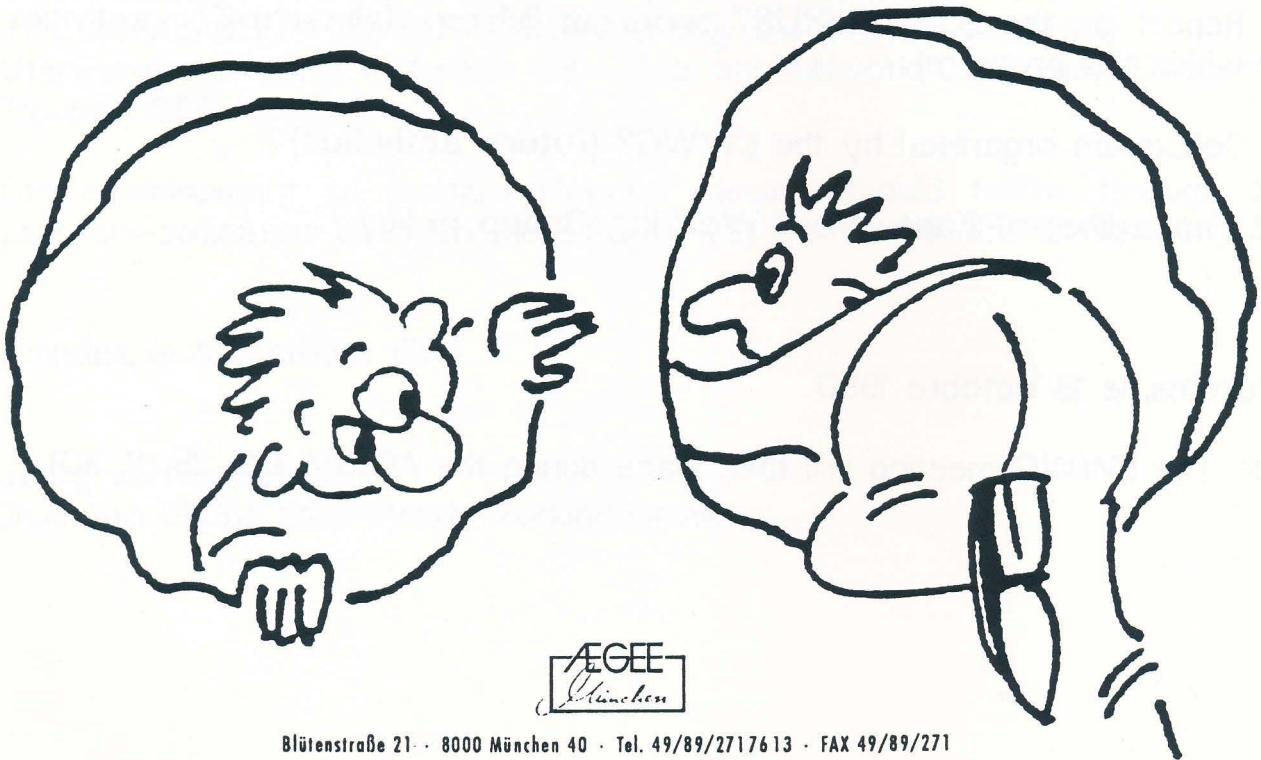
