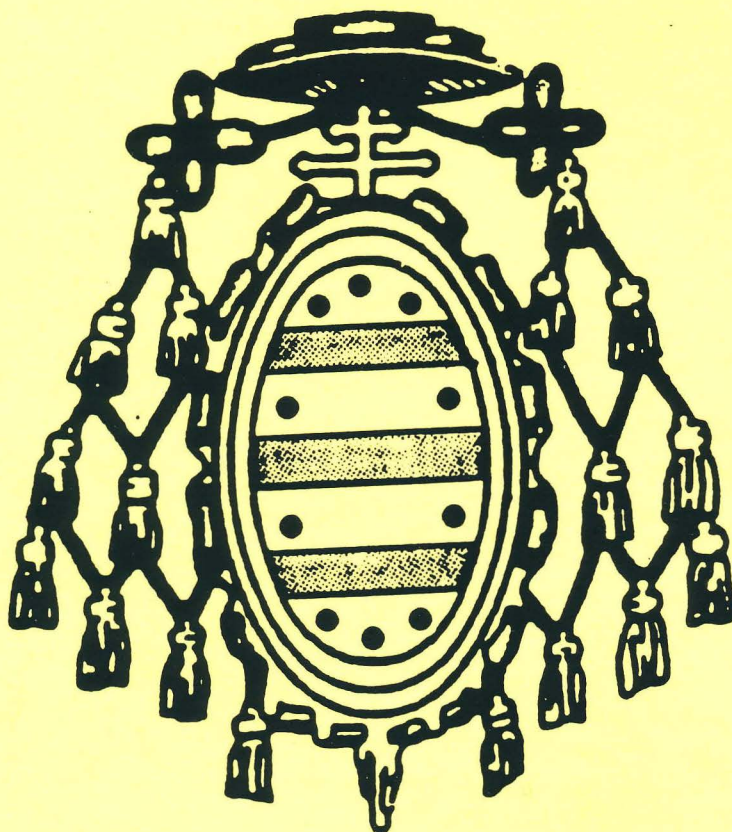

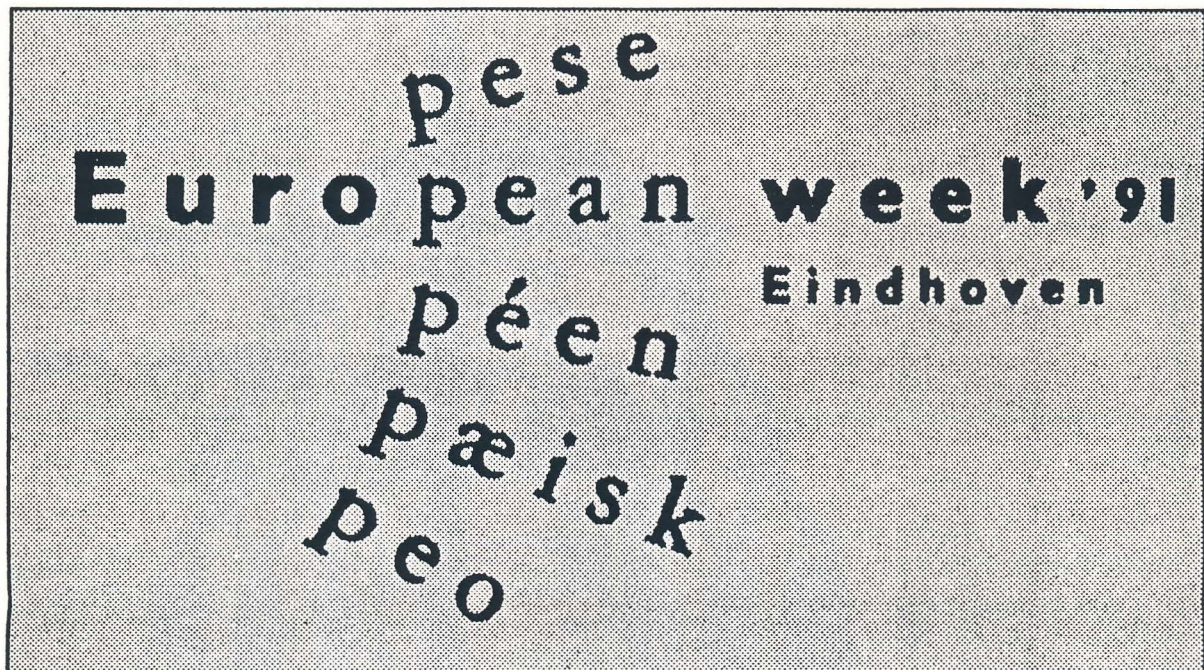

Energy controls our lives, can we control our energy?

The human race is facing one of the biggest challenges in its existence: how can we provide a sufficient supply of energy without endangering our environment?

This question plays an important role in the energy policy of the international community. Consequently, in the debates on the future course of action the relationship between expenditure of energy, environmental protection and economic prosperity has become the main issue. We know from experience that the transition to a society with different energy standards can only take place gradually. To effect transition international cooperation is essential in the fields of politics, trade and industry and science.

The European Community, as one of the major energy consumers, should serve as an example to others. Special attention should be paid to the often inefficient and highly polluting industrial complexes of Eastern Europe. Seen in this respect, the attempts to create a European energy market is a step in the right direction.

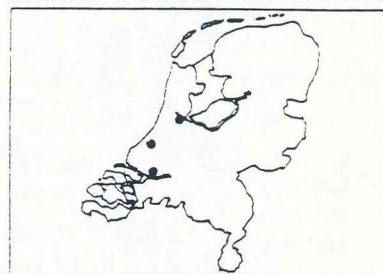
Aims of the organizers

AEGEE considers familiarizing European students with the energy problem as one of its tasks. With this end in view the AEGEE-antennae in Rotterdam, Leiden and Amsterdam have taken the initiative to organize the international "Energy and Europe"

conference. This conference will be held on the 24th, 25th and 26th of April 1991, in the cities mentioned above.

The conference

Each day of the conference will have its own subtheme.



The first day

locations

(Rotterdam) will consist in a historical overview of the energy problem, and a short glimpse into the future. Also the economic impact of changing patterns in energy consumption and the transition from one kind of energy to another will be illuminated.

The second day (Leiden) will focus on the European energy policy, including the setting up of a European energy market as mentioned in the "Lubbers' Energy Plan".

The third day (Amsterdam) will deal with prospects for issues such as: available sources of energy, their potential use on a large scale, their impact consequences on the environment and the renewed interest of politicians and scientists in nuclear energy.

Saarbrücken Academy

The antenna in Saarbrücken also plays an important role in this conference. During an Academy, preceding the conference, they will prepare and elaborate a thesis statement. The results will be made known during "Energy and Europe"



AEGEE-EUROPE: NEW ERASMUS TASKS

At the Bonn agora (23rd-25th November) an ERASMUS TEAM was established headed by the new ERASMUS responsible within the CD, Nikolaus Eberl. Considering that there is still a great lack of ERASMUS work within AEGEE and AEGEE is facing hard competition in this field with other student associations, it was decided that the tasks of the ERASMUS TEAM will consist of:

- 1) sending out a questionnaire to all antennae in order to get to know the current situation with ERASMUS in AEGEE;
- 2) sending information on ERASMUS as well as a detailed guideline "How to work with ERASMUS on a local level" to those antennae which are not yet working with ERASMUS;
- 3) holding an ERASMUS conference with all ERASMUS responsables at the Presidents Meeting which is to be held on 23rd - 24th February 1991 in Groningen;
- 4) organizing an AEGEE Europe Congress on ERASMUS in November 1991 which is to be held in Geneve in order to discuss specific items with representatives of other student associations and to prove the importance of AEGEE within the European university world.
- 5) compiling an "AEGEE-Guide of European Universities" which is to contain reports written by ERASMUS students on the conditions of studying at all universities linked with the ERASMUS programme. This AEGEE-Guide will be the first European university guide and of extremely importance for the development of AEGEE in view of the competition we are facing with other student associations. 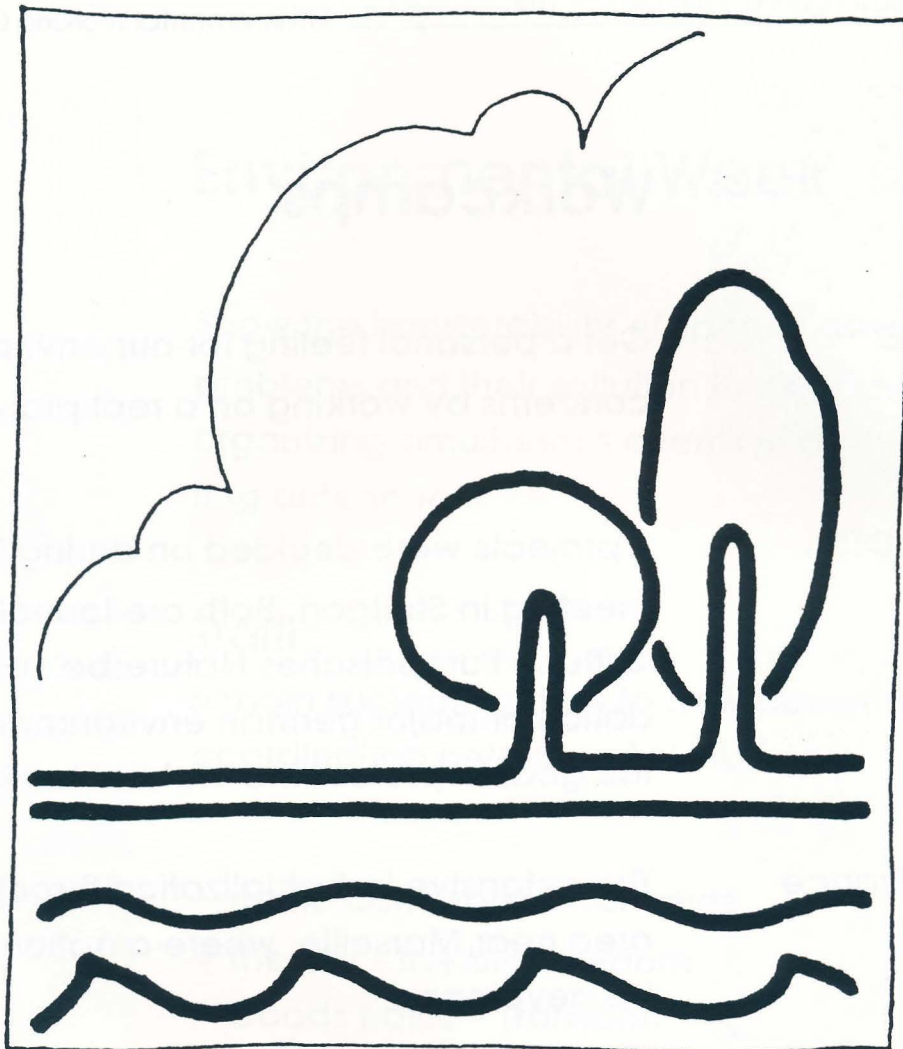

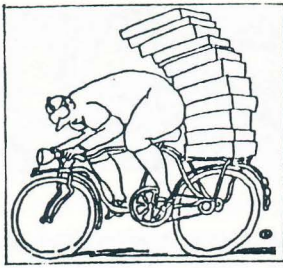

Record of the second meeting of the Environmental Working Group (EnWG) in Stuttgart-Hohenheim from November 2. to 4.

Represented were 18 students from 8 antennae as well as the President and the General Secretary of AEGEE-Europe. The names are available in an addresslist.

The meeting of the EnWG was organised by AEGEE-Stuttgart and the discussion coordinated by Florian Grohs.

1. Excursion to the "HYSOLAR"

The meeting started on Friday afternoon with a visit to the "Hysolar", the Institute for Solar Energy at the University of Vaihingen. The Institute works on concepts for storage of Solar energy and on similar topics. The visit showed clearly that using alternative energy demands even more high technology than conventional methods.

2. Environmental activities of the Antennas

Alexander Jandrey from Karlsruhe presented the activities of a club for solar cars in Karlsruhe. The club wants to promote the use of solar energy for cars using electricity instead of petrol. He suggested that the EnWG should coordinate activities between different European student groups interested in solar cars. Further information is available through Alexander.

Andreas Mohn and Florian Grohs organised a workshop about Europe and the environment at the last meeting of all German ecological student groups in Wiesbaden. Carsten from Osnabruck and Peter Simon from Karlsruhe will participate at the next meeting in Kaiserslautern.

Munster organised three trips to Bitterfeld, the most polluted town

in East Germany near Leipzig. Altogether 30 students from 5 antennae visited the town and were deeply moved by the depressing sight of yellow sulphur steams coming out of factory slots as well as the different colors of a small lake used as a dump yard for industrial waste. Munster will continue to support the environmental group of Bitterfeld.

3. Working Format

The EnWG decided on a working format describing the tasks and responsibilities of the EnWG within AEGEE. The working format is essentially based on a proposal of Munster. It is added to this record. The EnWG wants to confirm the independence of the working groups to choose their representatives according to the working format through election of the assembly. Therefore it is necessary to modify Article 25 of the statutes of AEGEE-Europe in the following way!

Article 25: "The Assembly of the working group elects their representatives according to the rules of the working format. The CD can appoint other representatives only for important reasons."

Every member should try to promote the modification in his antenna and within AEGEE-Europe.

4. The Environmental Week (EnW)

The antenna Mannheim presented a concept for the next EnW taking place in May 1991. It will coordinate all necessary activities. The main topic will be traffic and the antenna gave ideas on what can be done at the local antennae.

 - public transportation

- b) The car, the big freedom
 - increasing traffic,
 - ecological consequences, external effects,
 - who is paying the bill,

 - transportation of dangerous goods,
 - combination of lorries and railroad,
 - just in time supply,
 - airborne and naval traffic,
- d) Traffic development in Europe
 - common market 1992
 - traffic without boundaries
 - Germany -a transit country
 - The Alps -like a needle's eye

- e) Future projects
 - the transrapid
 - integrated European high speed railroad system
 - intelligent traffic systems
 - traffic 2000 -Prometheus-

Preliminary timetable

- Dec.90 preparation and distribution of final draft.
- Jan.91 Feedback of all antennae
- Feb.91 Informations by Mannheim
- Apr.91 Feedback of antennae
- May 91 Second Environmental Week
- Jul.91 Final summary and booklet

The exact week will be fixed in December.

Mannheim will try to get financial support from the EC for the participation antennae. A sheet of information will be prepared for distribution within AEGEE and for interested persons from outside. It was suggested to look at the Con

gress on Transport in Europe in Delft and to include the experience gained at the congress. Every member of the EnWG should mail all information about traffic to Mannheim (Jurgen Sachs). The EnW is one of the major projects of the EnWG and a good way to reach southern antennae.

5. The environmental Congress

The European Environmental Congress will take place from the 17. - 21. April 1991 in Munster. Munster is already organising the event very intensively and presented their work at the meeting. An information leaflet is attached. 250 students from all over Europe are expected. Altogether 17 workshops and excursions will be organised by Munster and 5 other antennae.

-Alternative methods of agriculture (Stuttgart)

-Gene technology (Amsterdam)

-Transferability of ecological measures in economical and political areas (Amsterdam)

-Environmental protection at European universities (Osnabruck)

-The energy game (Utrecht)

It was suggested to look for many international speakers to emphasize the global (European) importance of environmental protection. Further suggestions should be forwarded to Munster.

6. The Environmental Workcamps

The EnWG will offer two workcamps during summer 1991, one in France and one in Greece. Both workcamps will be organised in cooperation with the Foundation of European Heritage (Stiftung europaisches Naturerbe).

France

Location: National park of "Crau" between Arles and Marseille,

Duration:

Two weeks for 15 participants,

Work:

four hours a day fencing a national park, excursions in the afternoon,

Fees:

Not more than 85 ECU, accommodation free, transport has to be organised.

Alexander Jandrey from Karlsruhe will coordinate this workshop.

Greece

This workshop will be coordinated by Henning Tegner from Munster.

7. The photo exhibition

Munster has initiated a European photo exhibition with the topic "Meetings in Europe - Man and his environment" The project is funded by the city of Munster. Deadline is the 15. February and the touring exhibition will start from beginning of April 1991.

8. Public relations

Peter Simon proposed a logo for the EnWG that has been accepted. All members should try to get information about the congress and the EnW into newspapers, environmental information bulletins or other sources for European students. Maastricht, Delft, Utrecht, and Gottingen are working on a booklet about the policy of the EC concerning the environment. It will be presented at the congress in Munster.

9. Elections

The first elections of AEGEE representatives have taken place in Stuttgart. The responsibilities of the representatives are described in the working format.

speaker:

Andreas Mohn from Munster has been elected speaker of the EnWG.

He will continue for half a year until the next meeting in Munster.

vicespeaker:

Patrick Klein Breteler from Amsterdam has been elected. He will be responsible for public relations and the information flow within the EnWG.

treasurer:

Stepahn Deiher from Mannheim has been elected. He will be responsible to work out the Finance-Format of the EnWG together with the speaker and to present it at the next meeting.

10. The next meeting

The next EnWG meeting will take place on Sunday, 21. April 1991 in Munster at the congress. At this meeting the activities (congress, EnW) for 1992 have to be planned and a new speaker has to be elected.

Keeper of the minutes were Sigrid Speidel and Florian Grohs from Stuttgart.

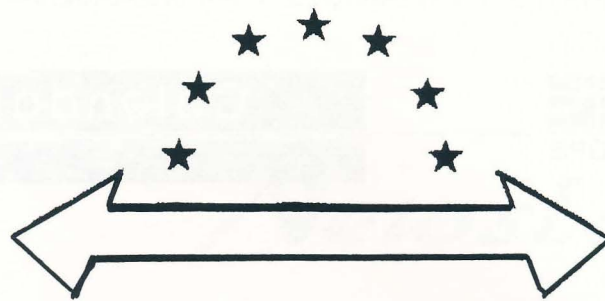
