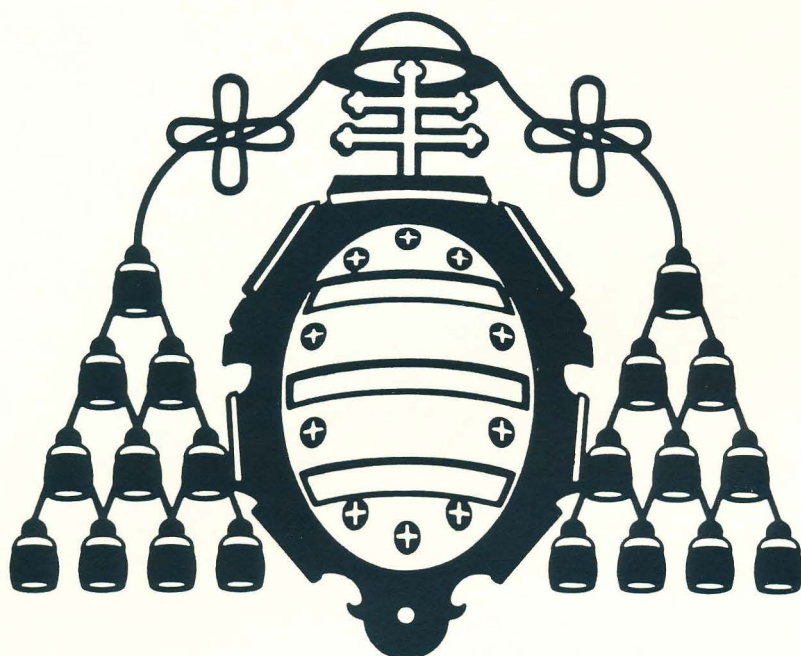

The Agora in Amsterdam

It was a great privilege to organize an AGORA for AEGEE-Europe. Especially when more and more antennas are created all over Europe. Receiving the registration forms was a pleasure. From over 50 antennas, from 18 different countries, 295 AEGEE-members registered. A lot of people also attended the EGEE VII congress, 'Energy and Europe'. With a lot of blood, sweat and tears everything was arranged. Together with the congress-committee we found lodging places, we tried to solve the moneyproblems, took care for food and beverages, registration, faxing for visas, beer and cigarettes...

Then the end of April. The congress was finished. Three tiring, but exiting days in Rotterdam, Leiden and Amsterdam were going to culminate into the Gala. But before the party could start we had to find a nice, warm place to sleep for all our guests. They were there, the people who registered for the AGORA, but not only the people who registered. Also participants for the congress, and above all, a lot of not-registered AEGEE-members wanted a place to stay. I have never seen such a big mess. Trying to stay calm, when you have some 300 places with members of AEGEE-Amsterdam, but over 400 people looking for a nice bed. I don't know how we did it, but we managed. Even on Saturday when there was a new boom of arriving friends, we did not have to send anyone to the Central Station.

We need to thank all our guests for their understanding.

"AEGEE is one of the most rapid growing studentassociations in the world", as a reporter from an Amsterdam universitypaper wrote. This reporter was one of the visitors during the cheerful moments of the inauguration of our new antennas. it seemed an endless list: Cluj, Budapest, Turku, Sofia, Salzburg, Warsaw ...In my personal opinion this was the absolute highlight of the AGORA.

Afterwards we realized that we succeeded in creating a quiet ambience, as we promised. A new electionsystem was accepted, although it took a long time. For the first time in the history of AEGEE, -I think-, the moral report of the president did not lead to any hot discussion.

We would like to thank those people who were present in Amsterdam, and in particular those who gave us nice compliments. After all it is the people who create the good atmosphere ! We also thank the people who complained about the payments for the beverages, hoping they enjoyed their meals.

What is left to say when the party is over? As we already said before, AEGEE is more alive than ever. Cliché or not, it seems to be a true saying: AEGEE is alive! After six years of struggle for life, our association is becoming a grown-up bunch of antennas. There is more than just hope for the future. We really believe in our association. When we look at the Calendar of Events, full of happenings again, and when we look at the list of antennas organizing a Summer University, there are lots of opportunities to travel. Good luck to all organizers.

AEGEE-Amsterdam celebrated its Fifth Anniversary. We were glad that so many AEGEE-friends came over to celebrate with us.

The International Discussion Club Moscow

asks for your attention for its new projects which have been worked out together with the students' association of the Moscow Physics-Engineering Institute (MIFT):

"International students' summer camp" and "Ecological tour by yachts on the Wolga"

The summer sport camp will work from July 1st until August 20th, 1991. We propose you spend your holidays in a picturesque, ecologically clean place on the Wolga, 170km away from Moscow. You will relax, you may play sport, swim, go fishing, collect mushrooms and -which is the most important- you will have the opportunity to communicate with students from the Soviet Union and other European countries. We don't pursue any commercial aims and the price of approximately 25 ECU (50 DM) per week will be fully used to cover the cost of your accommodation (in small wooden huts for two persons) and your food. For an extra payment you may make excursions, which will be arranged according to your wishes, to Moscow, Leningrad and the European part of Russia.

The tour on the middle part of the Wolga will take place at the end of July. The tour will start in Samara (Kuibyschew) and end in Nidzniy nowgorod (Gorki). The aim is to draw attention to the problem of the pollution of small rivers in Russia. Representatives of ecological and green movements from Russia and Europe and members of the Environmental Working Group of AEGEE are expected to participate in the tour. Price: 75 ECU (150 DM). duration 1 week. It is not expected that you are able to sail. The tour can be continued on the lower part of the Wolga, to the Caspian Sea. An extraordinary rest, a fishing trip and a sunburn are guaranteed to you.

It is advisable to combine both offers. We hope our suggestions have aroused your interest.

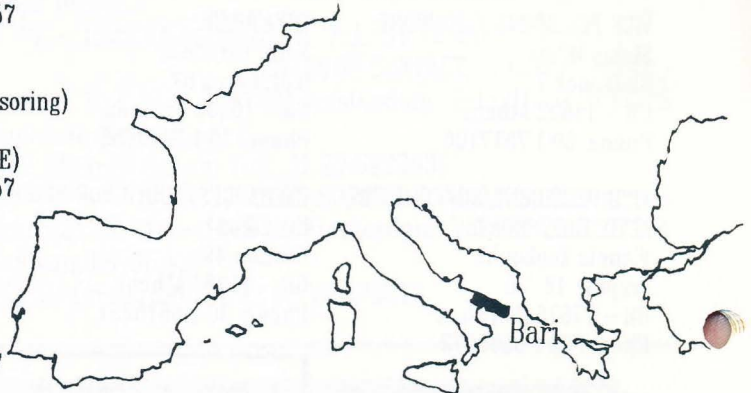

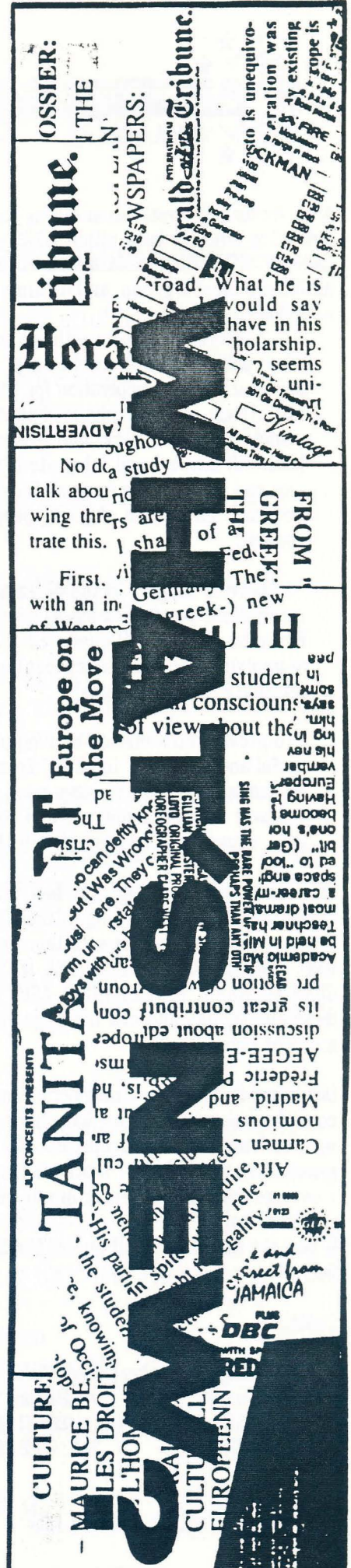

The membership of the Velvet network is entirely free, given that it will be financed by companies desirous of being associated with the best European students. More than 20 famous institutions already participate in the Velvet network through Europe.

Nevertheless, this association will need our help to develop itself. In return for it, AEGEE will have 3 complementary supports of communication to promote its activities IN Europe.

Our ambitions are similar: the students' mobility, a mutual recognition of our degrees and thirdly, the promotion of the events we organize.

A report of the North-Eastern regional meeting, 13 and 14 April in Enschede

Introduction

With this article I would like to offer you, AEGEE'ers, the conclusions of our fruitful regional meeting, held in Enschede by the North-East region on April the 12th and 13th.

The first issue we discussed concerned the idea of the region-almeeting itself, does AEGEE need a third level (regional) and if it does, how should it be implemented? Clearly, as academics, we questioned the role of our own structure during an entire Saturday morning. After a well organized restaurant-lunch for a few people, we divided ourselves into three workshops, interesting is our view of the CD's role and an important motivation theory we are holding activities on which we build our reputation, the quality of these activities is the basis of our future reputation. This reputation is the basis of much of the motivation within AEGEE. The idea presented by AEGEE-Enschede was that, if we like it or not, we are dealing with marketing. On Sunday, after a terrific European Night and after a too large brunch (because not enough of you were around to eat it all), the European Data-base project was presented after an exchange of ERASMUS experiences. AEGEE-Maastricht presented their healthcare working group as a try-out presentation for the Amsterdam-Agora.

1) AEGEE-Europe reorganized

The Regional level is ill-defined. The region's borders are, as they should be, cross-country, so as to define very international regions. After the historic fall of the iron curtain, these regions became certainly much too large and inconvenient to stay with. Ideological reasons were the basis for the current regional borders. Borders through countries and no borders on "real" borders, that was the main idea, but what is the regions true function? isn't a presidents' meeting enough? Can't locals work together without a regional meeting? Can't we discuss AEGEE, a complex and interesting network as it is, during other international events, Agoras, conferences and such? NO!, at least this was our definite and absolute conclusion. But how then?, one may ask. Well, we went to work and this led us towards a more flexible plan.

First, our main goals for regional meetings. 1) Exchanging ideas between local locals. This will stay the same and has an informal nature, it really is very fruitful. Really! 2) For the CD, (the CD is always present at a regional meeting) it is probably the most important and efficient method for getting feed-back. We find, after a well organized and qualitative discussion, that the CD's feed-back is much better via through discussions at a regional meeting than through any other means. 3) Personal contact-building between the ever-changing boards and the CD is rather intense during a regional meeting. We find this important. Of course there are many secondary reasons as well, these are also more easier criticized, although certainly worth mentioning: Regions main purpose:

- the above previewed three main items
- Link between Agora and locals
- Educative reasons for potential future board members
- As a strike against isolation, you can easily take an initiative to communicate with others.
- As an Agora discussing level
- it is important for the motivation and stimulation of your own board, you can see how others work and what they achieved
- it is multi-national, an AEGEE-goal
- it is very well possible to take time to reflect and discuss AEGEE as a European organization and how it should work, could work, must work and how it actually works. These conclusions have come forth out of such a discussion.

One of the main ideas is to let the regional meeting-idea work better is to forget the regional borders. Coordinated by the CD or maybe even not, locals should just organize regional meetings, certainly if they find that certain AEGEE-policies don't work right such policies are then very well suited for discussion, brainstorming and new initiatives produced by the multi-minded and multi-local regional-meeting. Together with your (of course international) neighbours you are absolutely better in producing good ideas and criticism.

2) Our expectations of the CD's work

All in all we concluded that the CD should be working on, what we called, "European Human Resources Management". Managing, motivating others to implement and making sure that the implemented actually is implemented is our main expectation of the CD. It isn't so that we find that the CD should implement their work themselves, they should "hand it out", which of course also is a lot of work. Of course, and that must stay the same as it is today, the CD will stay responsible for what they ought to and also do initiate. The next list shows our main expectations. Point one consists all the other points combined together and has top priority. Points to two five, each have second priority and the other

points all have third priority.

- 1) European Human Resources Management
- 2) Sponsoring, (on basis of objects or activities)
- 3) Local activities. A referee function, advice (like "how to start a local" and so on) and support.
- 4) Public Relations. We find the programme, and not the material most important. The material often has to be in local language anyway.
- 5) Communication. Important communication lines are those between the CD and the local boards, the CD and the members, the CD and the outside world and the lines between AEGEE-Europe and the members of AEGEE as a whole. We find that a CD should implement these necessities via the following: A main office, a News-Bulletin for all members, at least the bulletin should be promoted as for all members, news-bulletin information should be printed if possible in the local news organs.
- 6) Education and information offering to (potential) members
- 7) Stimulation & motivation via for instance and as a good start, sticking to their own deadlines.
- 8) Specialism & functional responsibility of CD-members should go together with a strong and healthy general interest of AEGEE as a whole, so we expect.
- 9) idealism. We expect that the CD has a long term vision of AEGEE and that this idealism can be brought back to earth, "applied idealism".
- 10) Structural professionalism. By this we mean that Agoras, presidents' meetings and so on should be organized professionally, it is important that the know-how for these events be kept within the CD.
- 11) AEGEE-Europe events. AEGEE-Europe should NOT organize events on its own just to be organizing! What we expect is a CD that coordinate, advise (Knowledge bank or so), and support local and multi-local activities. In case of major European political, economical or maybe even severe changes (economical-war, new curtains, non-international changes), AEGEE-Europe, of course should react.
- 12) We find it O.K. if CD members are members for C.V. advantages, but then they MUST show their responsibility they have taken upon them.

This is what we expect of a CD. Of course AEGEE is still young and in time these expectations may vary but we believe that these points are well suited as goals, specific and concrete points. A CD can use and we find should use these goals to strive after. With such a list, the CD knows what the local boards find of the CD and we hope it may offer the CD some basis for the structure AEGEE will find in the future.

3) Motivation of participants and activists

AEGEE as an organization organizes activities. Therefore she must have motivated activists (those who organize) and motivated participants (members who are potential participants must take certain obstacles to participate, often they must be motivated to do so). AEGEE-Enschede finds, and you just cannot deny it, that we are dealing with the principles of marketing and that these principles are amongst the main motivating criteria. Why? because we, the organizers, are offering a product, namely an event. We are asking a certain price (valuable study time and money) for our product (I will use "activity" in stead of the word product, for those who aren't so business-minded). Of course we are promoting our event one way or another and furthermore the place where the activity will be is of importance. Marketing is based upon the combination of the four P's: product (activity), price (time + \$), promotion and place. So we are too dealing with marketing principles.

Achievement our activities' goals is dependent of right mix of P's we use to reach these goals, reaching the goals means reaching the quality product we wanted and this quality helps to build our organization's reputation implicitly motivating potential activists and more explicitly motivation our participants. What is a right mix? For example, everybody knows the cities Berlin, Paris, Enschede, Milano and Amsterdam. These cities have a better "place", at least for major events than for instance the lesser known (I don't want to be too personal) Madrid, Rotterdam and München, or so. Anyway, they must offer a better product, price or promote to achieve the same result. It is very important to realize this!

Motivating new members by "choosing" new members may also have a certain positive effect. At a local level, AEGEE-members often have extremely different interests. A board may, within its own "human resources management policy" try to develop dimensions by which new members should score. For instance, European mindedness should score more than the average, potential to become an activist, criticism against or for a certain life-style (to wear a tie or to hate ties, to like economy and law or to dislike them and study biology, or to dislike them all and study Danish). The idea is to try to have a certain spearpoint group in your recruiting new members. Of course it absolutely shouldn't

be the idea to ever say No to a new member. In the long term, this at least proves to be motivating for your local activities.

4) On the European Data-base Structure

During the Agora in Bonn, you, the locals, decided upon working with such a data-base so you can get information from other locals in order to see what you can expect from other locals if you want to cooperate or if you want to promote your own major events. Of the 80 questionnaires, only 26 were received as of April 12th! Send it in! if you have any questions, phone Oliver Peltzer. On request, the data-base will be sent to you on floppy disk.

5) ERASMUS presentation and an exchange of good ideas

A good ERASMUS working group or commission can earn you a University room or some money or even both! With ERASMUS, the student-expecting University must offer the expected student, by contract, a decent introduction. This means an introduction for the student's programme but also a social introduction. Here lies an opportunity for you AEGEE locals! Universities find it time and money costly to offer these facilities to ad hoc incoming ERASMUS students. But AEGEE can do the task. And AEGEE locals, like Berlin, are doing this well, others aren't at all. In Enschede we are almost started, in Münster the ERASMUS programme hasn't started yet. If you want more information contact the CD which has a very well operating ERASMUS working group and you can of course always visit or even organize a regional meeting to exchange know-how and experiences.

A brainstorming and exchange session proved to be very educational.

possible local ERASMUS activities followed by concrete results

- Reception prizes, social introduction/integration between students.
- Trip to a local country town/cultural education and integration
- Monthly evaluation meeting between AEGEE and all those of interest (stakeholders)/ stronger coordination with university, list of practical exchange results, monthly information for local introduction. It is of extreme importance to know where to find the information concerning incoming ERASMUS students so you can contact them BEFORE they arrive. Only then can you assist, support and introduce them fully. Of course your university will admire such work, this can only be to your advantage!
- You can lobby for courses in foreign languages, certainly if your home-language (for instance Dutch) isn't well known abroad./ Such lobby might to more exchange students within Europe!
- You should coordinate with other international groups within your university. They often don't have the same goals but cooperation can't hurt. Universities usually will want to lead to one institution, in that case you can define such an institution together, it is important that AEGEE takes the initiative for in the long run, AEGEE can then profit most (by achieving its own goals and building a sound reputation with your local university).
- Offer information for studying abroad and promote this, your university will like the initiatives and you can ask infra-structural help (office or such) for your work.

How to contact exchange students? This is very hard because of the extreme decentralization. Via your own set of contacts and possible monthly communication with them, you can gather this valuable information so you can timely contact your exchange student.

6) Maastricht's Working Group: Health and healthcare

At the end of our wonderful regional meeting, well sponsored, cheap and well organized but shamefully badly visited by you, you didn't even know you wasn't coming, AEGEE-Maastricht presented us their new working group. The same presentation is held at the Agora in Amsterdam. We wish AEGEE-Maastricht success with their working group, success with their ecological-bus plan during the environmental week and success with their lecture on May 6th. They at least, of course with a reasonable group of others, visited our regional meeting and helped us to come to such well placed conclusions, of course we don't mind your not coming if you must come from very far, the regions are too large, as discussed earlier.

AEGEE-Enschede would like to thank the CD for its appearance and of course thanks all whom have taken part in the regional meeting. We would also be obliged to see our entire article in the News Bulletin and sincerely hope you have read the article with an interest. These conclusions are the result of an interesting and educational debate. Please use them for your own good.
