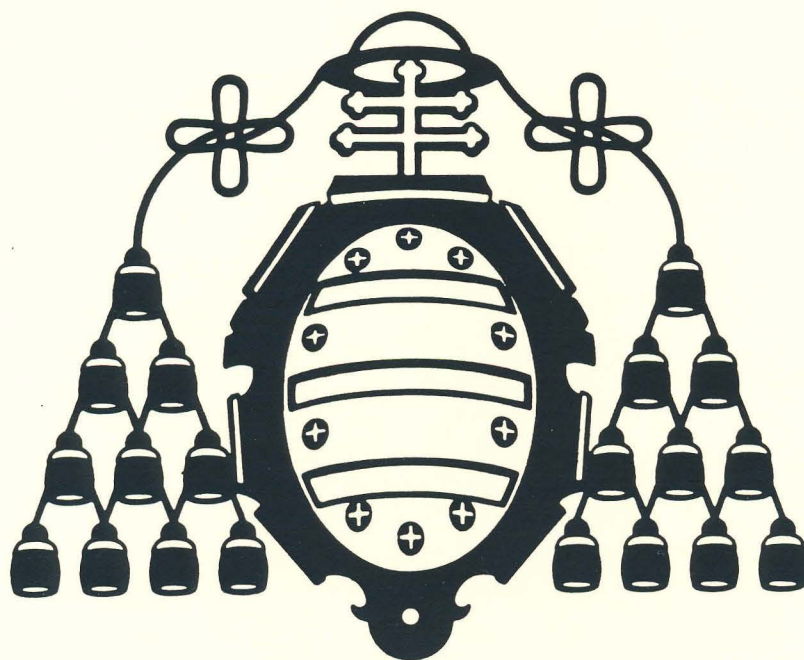

In 1990 I had a very active ÆGEE year, the first one for me, and I got to know quite well the structure of the association and its working system but I couldn't help wondering what were the Comité Directeur of ÆGEE-Europe doing. In 1991 as a member of the CD myself, I also got to know that but I still think that many ÆGEE members don't know what being a CD member means. It means of course a lot of work, a network like ours needs a lot of coordination, but there are also so many people working very hard for ÆGEE from out of the CD ... It also means new goals and tools, giving a new meaning to words like development and cooperation. In short, it widens and enriches your thoughts on the association and offers you an overview of what we all are doing in fact, at the different antennae and through the different projects that I could never before have. Since I joined "the board" I spent even more of my daily time for ÆGEE, but I'm sure that not much more than many of you. Of course it was hard and sometimes even very hard and awful; and always difficult to travel to CD meetings, sometimes longer in the train than in the meetingroom itself, or not even knowing in what part of the city we were after 2 days staying there. Sometimes we had neverending nonsense discussions (or I thought so), and we got really angry, but, even if it sounds strange now, it was altogether nice. It was nice to meet people working hard for the same ideals that moved me, and it was nice to get fresh monthly news on the situation that gave me the feeling of knowing what I was working for. It was nice to see that we were doing somethings right and not so nice to see what we were doing wrong. Finally it was nice to see that after almost a year working for development of ÆGEE, in September we met in Oviedo people from 13 different antennae or contacts in Spain, which can mean a rich future for ÆGEE in our region.

In the next Agorá ÆGEE will face its first personal elections for the CD, and up to now it doesn't seem that many people are longing to offer their time and energy in this board. So I want to tell you that it is worth working on it, and that if you are already working hard for ÆGEE, working from the CD could offer you a wider view on the association, and maybe even higher means as long as, definitively, higher goals. ÆGEE-Europe is needing people to work from its board, so if you are willing to spend your time for it, you have your chance in Budapest.

WHY US?

For many years the center of AEGEE's activities has been located in Central and Northern mainland Europe. AEGEE Athina one of the oldest antennae (1986) -and until recently a very lonely one! - can help change this, since we believe that it is time for AEGEE to organize an Agorá in the South-East of Europe, also promoting in this way the AEGEE idea in our Region.

WHY A PROPOSAL FROM ATHINA NOW?

In 1992 the anniversary of 2500 years of Democracy will be celebrated. We are convinced that it would be the perfect way for AEGEE to honour the occasion, by having the Agorá held at its original birthplace!

WHEN AND WHERE?

We propose that the Spring 92 Agorá is held at the Asklepieion Conference Center in the island of Kos (Hippocrates's island) during the weekend 18/19 April 92.

WHY THERE?

Since the delegates will travel to Greece, it's imperative to visit one of the islands. Kos has not only a lot of natural beauties but also an ideal conference infrastructure, because of the many medical congresses held there. Also local authorities have shown a particular interest and pledged for providing all the necessary (lodging, transportation, Conference center etc.)

WHY THEN?

The weekend 18/19 April is the weekend preceding the Holy Week before Easter. Thus students delegates will have the time to travel (and even prolonge their vacation if they wish so) and also experience the island's landscape and Eastern customs at its best time. It will also help us with organization matters.

WHAT ABOUT THE LODGING?

A high quality hotel will be provided by the local authorities capable of hosting all delegates/representatives for free. Reasonably-priced lodging can be provided to observers.

WHERE WILL THE Agorá TAKE PLACE?

The Asklepieion Conference Center will be at our disposal for the time needed. Transportation from / to the hotel will be arranged.

HOW DO YOU GET TO KOS?

By plane:

There are direct flights from Athens airport every day by Olympic Airways (round trip costs about 110 ECU)

In April charter flights to Kos from major European airports are also available.

By surface:

Participants, after arriving in Athina (by any mean of transport) will have to take the boat that leaves daily from the Piraeus Port. (cost of round trip is about 36 ECU, arranged to be provided to Agorá participants for half price that is 18 ECU). An Athens student travel agency in the center of Athens, cooperating with us, will be at all participants' disposal for information, registration and travel information. It will also help those who -for any reason- need cheap accommodation or tickets in Athens or any other place.

WHAT IF ...?

As we all know, in AEGEE events anything is possible! However we are convinced that no problem will be so big that we won't be able to handle ... and this Agorá will be one more of AEGEE's historical events!!!

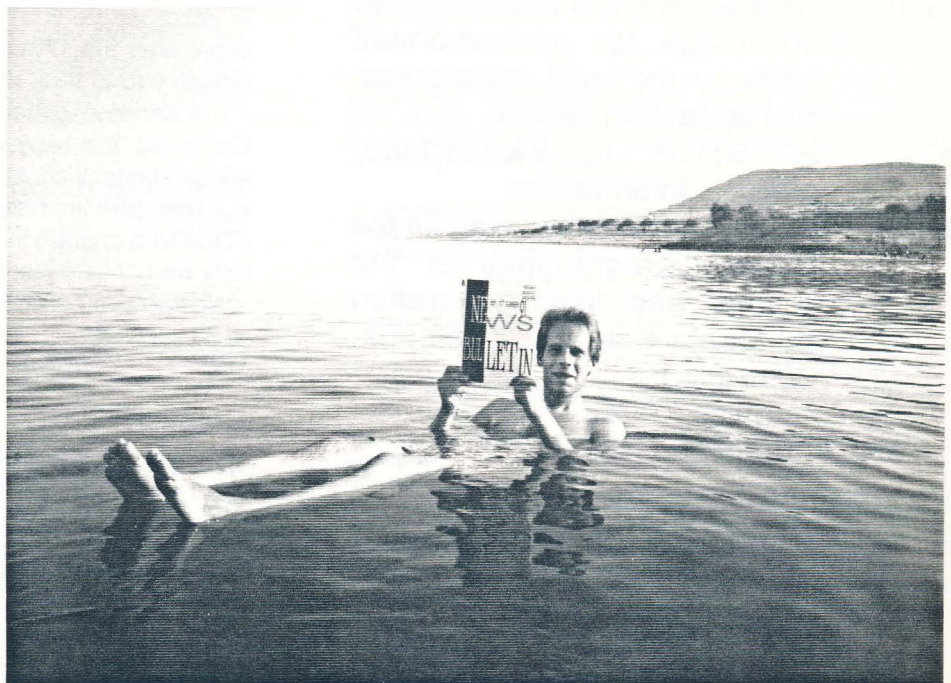

If you are brave enough to visit Russia in winter, if you want to improve your Russian or to start learning this language, if you are interested in winter sports, if you want to have friends in Russia - you are invited to participate in the

WINTER UNIVERSITY - ÆGEE-MOSCOW

You may join the 10 days programme (20.12.91. - 30.12.91., 28 hours of classes) or the 20 days programme (20.12.91. - 10.01.92., 56 hours of classes). We expect up to 20 students to come. We also propose a 3 days excursion to Saint Petersburg, former Leningrad, for the interested ones. The participant's fee is 80 ECU for 10 days (tuition, lodging, food and sports equipment are included).

The sports programme includes a land-cross skying and russian baa (sauna). A one-day ecological seminar is also expected. The culture programme includes visiting the museums and historical places of Moscow and surrounds. And, of course, you'll have an opportunity to see the life of Russian students with your own eyes.

We'll try to provide a good weather during the Winter University. (The temperature will be +2 to -10 C. and there will be at least 3 sunny days.

Conclusions of the ERASMUS Academy held in Oviedo, 17-22 September

The first edition of this annual congress, which took place in Oviedo, on the 18th, 19th and 20th of September, at the Chamber of Commerce of Oviedo, drew to an end of its working agenda on Friday 20th.

The almost 160 participants from different various European countries (including a good number of students from the University of Oviedo) contributed very actively towards the elaboration of practical results and conclusions regarding student mobility within Europe.

A document of the conclusions obtained in the "ERASMUS Academy", supported by all the participants and speakers (European Student Associations, Universities, ERASMUS Bureau), as well as the expectations of the aforesaid concerning institutions and bodies competent in the field of mobility, will be sent to:

- Universities
- National Agencies for ERASMUS grants (NGAAs)
- ERASMUS Bureau
- Commission of the EC
- Council of Europe
- European Student Associations

The main objective of sensibilization of the participants and awareness of the problems of the mobility programmes has been fully achieved. Activities like these contribute in a very significant way to facilitate integration among the European Youth and therefore to the construction of a United Europe.

CONCLUSIONS

1. The great development of the mobility programmes is allowing a great number of European students to get to know other cultures, learn other languages and understand other ways of thinking ..., but the mobility budgets are not growing at the same rate as the number of programmes.

2. All the parts involved (Universities, European student associations, ERASMUS Bureau) agreed on the main problems for the exchange students:

- lack of information for the student before going abroad
- lodgings
- small amount of the ERASMUS grant
- difficulties in the academic and social integration
- lack of linguistic preparation in minority languages

3. All the participants expressed their will to work towards practical solutions that were obtained in the experiences of the different "antennae" of GEE in Europe, particularly in ÆGEE-Oviedo (model to be followed): mentorship, legal and lodging assistance, excursions, language courses, ...

4. All the exchange students (ERASMUS, Tempus, Lingua, Comett) are included in the programmes of assistance that were obtained throughout the

Congress as an homogeneous result to be applied in the whole of Europe about assisting in ERASMUS at a local level.

5. Cooperation among all student associations at all levels is necessary: among all the European associations, among these and the representatives in the Universities, elected student bodies, faculty student councils. Joint actions of the European student associations before the Commission of the CEE are basic so as to achieve sufficient economic support for putting their activities into practice.

6. The Tempus programme and the students of the Eastern countries present peculiarities and problems that need special attention.

7. The best way of resolving the above mentioned problems in point 2 is through a narrow collaboration at a local level between the University and active associations in the mobility field. At a European level a great information flow and continuous communication between the Commission, ERASMUS Bureau, National Agreements and European associations can solve many problems.

8. Expectations of the participants regarding the competent institutions in the mobility of students:

- University: material support, infrastructure and money, communication flow, ...
- National Agency: Distribution of the payment of ERASMUS grants on time, more informative support at a national level
- ERASMUS Bureau: material (Directories, Bulletins) and information support.
- EC Commission: economic support to the capable and experimented associations that can obtain actual results and solutions. Increase of the mobility budget.
- European associations: Put into practice. Communication and motivation of students and teachers.

9. The congress "ERASMUS Academy", gets established as the first practical forum about problems in the mobility field of students. It will be held annually and next year will be organized by another ÆGEE antenna a different place in Europe, probably focusing in the Tempus programme that will have a lot of importance in the integration of Europe.

10. The second edition of this meeting of student mobility in Europe, to be held in 1992 will help to study the evolution of the mobility programmes, to prove the validity of practical solutions at a local level obtained in Oviedo, and evaluate the motivation of the ÆGEE antennae and other European associations in their mobility work.

Hoping that these conclusions will be useful for a quick integration process of the European youth.

DRAFT OF THE PROGRAMME

Workshops Part 1

Politics: The Protection of Minorities

Black, Native Americans (Americans Indians) and Hispanic in the USA in comparison to foreigners and cultural minorities (e.g. Moslems) in European countries.

Economics: Industrial Policy

The emphasis on military research and the prominence of private investments ("venture capital") in the USA in comparison to European industrial policy.

Culture: A Common European Language

The advantages of a common language as in the USA and the problems associated with 9 official languages in Europe. A comparison also to the Canadian situation and its advantages / disadvantages.

Law: The Legislative Power of the European Community

The indirect actualization of European law through EC directives as compared to the constitutional division of State and Federal law in the USA.

Workshops Part 2

Politics: Political Parties

The 2 large heterogeneous parties in the USA in comparison to the number and incompatibility of European political parties and the problems this incompatibility creates in the European Parliament.

Economics: Agro-Business in Europe

Will agro-business, as is common in the USA, be the future of European farming, or will we be able to keep farming at the traditional, familiar level. Special attention should be paid to the agrarian states in Southern and Eastern Europe.

Culture: Religious Tolerance and Plurality.

The complete separation of Church and State in the USA as a model for the more theocratic European countries whose theocratic structure has been engraved through the historic influence of the Church on the State

Culture: European and American Art

The representation of national identity in European literature, music and painting as compared to the importance of regional differences in American Art.

Workshops part 3

Politics: A Politically Unified Europe

The need or lack of need for a common united political policy in Europe as a counterpart to the USA and the difficulties in forming such a policy. Do we need a collective European Security system?

Economics: A Central European Bank

The creation of a central European bank and a common currency using the Federal Reserve Bank of the USA as possible model.

Culture: the Educational System.

A comparison of the different educational systems of the European countries with the American educational system.

Law / Politics: Environmental Legislation.

A comparison of the different levels of environmental consciousness within Europe and the USA and EEC, (e.g. the system of incentives and penalties, positive and negative reinforcement)

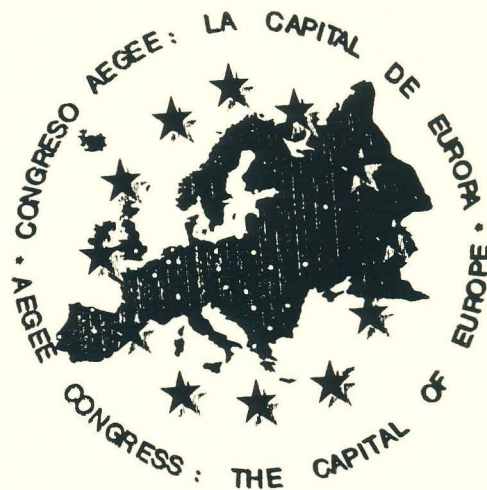
