### SYNOPSIS

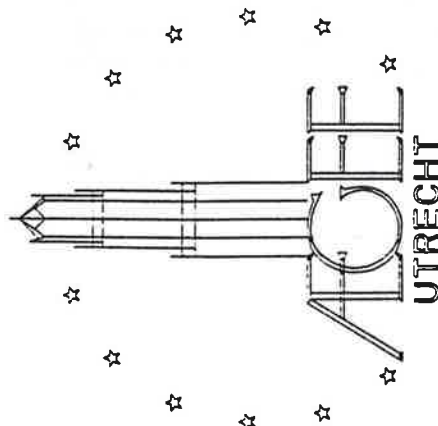

### THE FUTURE OF AEGEE

After important changes in the world and especially in Europe, new challenges and chances appear at the horizon of AEGEE. The revolutions and the new spirit could motivate young people to build a new, a common European House together.

Unfortunately many of us didn't feel this kind of mood during the last Agora in Paris. Already in that moment new visions of an integrated European students' association would have been possible: the first free and democratic elections in most East European countries had taken place.

Due to a lack of organization of the association and a lack of perspectives there was little motivation to work for AEGEE among the delegates and the members of the local AEGEEs.

However, the new European tasks as well as our own aims demand an active contribution of AEGEE-- not a wait for better times! With this paper we would like to initiate a basic discussion in order to develop new concepts and ideas for the future of AEGEE.

### WHAT IS EUROPE FOR AEGEE?

AEGEE has the aim of promoting the European idea among the students of Europe especially in the European Community as determined by the Statutes of 1985, Article 2.

From the beginning, the extension of the association to European countries beyond the borders of the Community was intended. Our main aim is not to build up barriers but to lower them. Nevertheless we should limit our field of activities to the possible member states of the EC defined in the EEC treaty, Article 237, considering social, geographical, cultural, and historical criteria.

### THE TASK OF AEGEE

After the pull down of the Wall and following the process of democratic reforms in East European countries, we have now the historical chance to realize the very first ideas of our association: promoting the European idea by building up an all-European organization of students. This way we shall overcome geographical, cultural, and mental barriers. We shall be open to everybody receptive to our ideas in order to gather students around our common aim.

Better knowledge of each other is the basis for taking care of common students' interests in an integrated European society. Instruments of such a students' lobby are Community programs such as ERASMUS, COMETT, or the new TEMPUS (actually for Poland and Hungary). AEGEE has to play an important role in the realization of these programs.

AEGEE should define positions concerning the situation of the students in Europe.

To realize these purposes the effective and well considered organisation of our association is necessary. The main pillars of AEGEE are the associated local groups ("antennae") and the European organs: Agora and Comité Directeur (CD).

## LOCAL AEGEEs ("ANTENNAE")

Most of the active members of AEGEE are working in local AEGEEs and in co-operation with members of other AEGEE antennae.

It is evident that a lot of good ideas and perspectives are born on this basic level of the AEGEE structure. A high degree of independence is necessary for the motivation of active members in order to realize these ideas. AEGEE does not need a fixed, detailed, coherent central organized plan of thinking but may be a group of people engaged in developing and realizing different European initiatives.

## AGORA

The Agora as the parliament of AEGEE is the most important body on the European level. It has to vote upon main aims and projects of the association, to elect the responsible representatives of the CD and commissions and to control the work of the CD, the commissions, the working groups and the local AEGEEs.

One of the main problems is the preparation of its decisions. Although the proposals to the Agora are sent to all antennae before the Agora, the delegates do not have enough background information to give a qualified vote. The proposals are often not discussed in the antennae, sometimes not even read by the delegates.

Furthermore positions become more fixed when they are discussed the first time in an Agora. There is almost no way for a dialogue in a plenary session.

Uninformed delegates just follow leaders without having a position of their own and without supporting their proper decision in an active way. The solution of these problems demands a better preparation of the Agora in the antennae.

Furthermore the decisions of the Agora should be discussed in working groups before the Agora. These groups may correspond to the topics of existing AEGEE-WGs as well as to important points of the Agenda of the Agora (statutes, Future of AEGEE, etc.). This kind of preparatory group meetings may take place on Saturday, preceding the plenary session, only on Sunday.

The delegates of every antenna could get sufficient informations and arguments in order to participate actively in the decision-making process of the Agora.

For the election of responsible persons it should be clear that an oral or written presentation of all candidates is necessary in order to guarantee transparent information for a discussion and the election.

At the end of their mandate every responsible person should render an individual account to the Agora in an oral or written way. A control of the organs of AEGEE by the Agora would otherwise not be possible.

The single-list system for electing the CD is not only out-dated as by now in the communist countries, but basically does not represent our goals. We therefore call for a democratic election instead of the former single-list.

This would imply that all members would be involved in the election process and thereby can recognize the CD as their selfelected body.

The question of the central office has to be solved within the next months. This is in the major interest of all AEGEE members in order to build up a good co-operation between AEGEE-Europe and the antennae.

The preceding remarks covered by no means all our current and structural difficulties, but it is an attempt to solve problems since so far -astonishingly- no signals have been sent in this direction.

Let us work together in developing ways and means of a creative path towards a democratic and promising future of our organisation.

Barcelona, July 13, 1990

As stated in the bulletin for Summer University 1990 the fee for all language courses was to be 85 ECU. Included in this should be the course plus accommodation. For the Barcelona Summer University however, the fee AEGEE Barcelona charged was 15.000 \$ (approx. 124,4 ECU). Though this included a small breakfast. The difference of 46\$ in price, however, is not in any way justified. For us as participants there has been no chance either to refuse or to reduce the charge. Not only as a matter of principle but also due to the ~~very~~ strained financial situation of some participants we decided to inform the people of AEGEE EUROPE involved in financial matters and the CD.

As written in the letter of invitation for the Summer University Barcelona "The price for the course as you know, is 15.000\$, which you are expected to pay..."

We feel that this is somewhat misleading.

WE PROPOSE THAT THE NEXT AGORA DECIDE TO COLLECT THE FEE FOR ALL SUMMER UNIVERSITIES EITHER IN ONE CENTRAL POINT IN EUROPE OR AT ONE POINT IN EACH COUNTRY.

ANOTHER POSSIBILITY IS TO DECIDE AT THE NEXT AGORA TO ALLOW ALL SUMMER UNIVERSITIES ANTENNAE TO VARY THE FEE WITHIN A GIVEN RANGE. We hope that within the CD and Financial Committee these topics will be seriously discussed and lead to a satisfactory result for the next Summer University 1991.

1º/ The figures about the AEGEE-Barcelona charges and their difference with regard to the alleged AEGEE-Europe Summer University fee (85 ECU) are exaggerated. If you make use of the attached information about the value of the ECU when

3º/ The human point of view: we have been all these days intending to do the stay of the participants as comfortable as possible and we find ourselves in front of a letter in which nothing is told about (although the participants are cognized privately that the organization and the activities have been quite good, with the normal mistakes, and quite far from disasters in the recent AEGEE-Europe history, like Paris 1990 ). We are really a bit disappointed after all our effort; is really worth enough to do a Summer University as well as you know to get this "gratitude"? We are thinking about for next year.

4º/ The alleged 85 ECU only could be demanded as fee if a real European coordination would exist; as this kind of coordination nowadays is a fantasy, it is not possible to say: we don't give you any help (at times, we do your work much more difficult with stupid rules) but we oblige you to put a determined price. Is this the politics of AEGEE-Europe? At least, it is not and it never will be the way of doing of AEGEE-Barcelona.

# Minutes of the East-West Working

## 1 RESULTS OF THE AGORA IN PARIS

At the Agora in Paris the proposal of AEGEE-Bonn concerning the status of the Eastern Contact Groups has been approved (see minutes of 28th January 1990). This means: the ECGs will become an AEGEE contact group as soon as free and democratic elections have taken place in their respective countries and change into an AEGEE-local after the organization of a European event. Furthermore, they have the right to participate at any AEGEE event.

The EWWG was authorized in Paris to set up its own proposals for future Agoras. Beyond that representatives of the EWWG have from now on the right to speak at the Agora.

As Soviet students were among the participants, the question arose whether they can found an ECG as well. They outlined their interest in regular contacts with AEGEE and offered to organize an event in Moscow at the beginning of 1991.

Some speakers pointed out that according to the decision of the Agora in Sevilla the USSR (as well as Turkey) is not considered as a European country. On the other hand, it was brought forward that this decision no longer corresponds to the political changes in Eastern Europe and has therefore to be updated. The overwhelming majority of the EWWG members voted in favour of regular contacts with Soviet students (13 in favour, 0 against, 1 abstention). Most participants expressed that there should be no discriminating against Soviet students and that they also should be given the chance to participate in the AEGEE network by forming ECGs.

An American student organisation at Boston University, represented by Michael Schoeller, expressed an interest in cooperation with AEGEE. Michael was referred to the board of AEGEE-Europe; AEGEE-Bonn is keeping the contact so far.

## 2 CONTACT GROUPS AND THEIR ACTIVITIES

**BRATISLAVA:** Founded one month ago, they have already established their statutes. They are considering organising a congress on cultural problems in October 1990 (Peter Novotny).

**HUNGARY:** Two contact groups will soon be established: one in Debrecen (Endes Gyory) and one in Budapest. AEGEE-Leipzig offered its assistance.

**BULGARIA:** A participant from Bulgaria (Ivo Kirilov Georgier) expressed his interest and will be given assistance by AEGEE-Berlin.

# Group Meeting, Berlin 19th May 1990

LEIPZIG: Founded in February 20, 1990 the group in Leipzig already has 30 members. They will organize a Summer University for Russian language studies.

## 3 THE INTERNSHIP-PROGRAMME

Rainer Ohliger of AEGEE-Freiburg is in the process of organizing an internship-programme for East European students and is asking for further internship places in Western enterprises. Please support this initiative. For further information contact him at Tel.: . . 49 / 761 / 27 79 52.

## 4 FORTHCOMING EAST-WEST PROJECTS OF AEGEE

The following projects were announced:

AEGEE-Bonn will organize a tour to USSR organized by Russian students between the 20th and 30th of July 1990. Participants from other locals are welcome to participate and may contact AEGEE-Bonn directly.

The EWWG, in cooperation with the "Friedrich-Ebert-Foundation", is conducting a seminar with Eastern and Western students on the topic: "Fundamente eines gemeinsamen europaeischen Hauses" (from Sept. 24 to 28, 1990; contact: Rainer Seider, Tel.: . . 49 / 228 / 21 10 07

For October and November AEGEE-Oviedo, AEGEE-Barcelona, and AEGEE-Enschede (in cooperation with AEGEE-Osnabrueck) are planning East-West events. Also AEGEE-Munich will discuss East-West relations (title: "East-West Relations - a new Era for Europe", from November 12 to 17, 1990).

## 5 INTERNAL AFFAIRS

The question of how to become a member of the EWWG seems to be somewhat unsettled. The members agreed that sending a postcard to AEGEE-Berlin (Georg v. d. Gablentz) -and thereby indicating one's interest- is sufficient.

The next EWWG meeting is scheduled for July 14/15, 1990 in Leipzig. We hope to see you all.

# A FEW REMARKS CONCERNING EUROPE'S OUTLOOK FOR THE 1990'S

## GERMANY AND EUROPEAN SECURITY

The so-called "German Question" will remain on the international agenda for years to come, certainly through this decade. The debate about how to anchor Germany in a European system so that it poses no security threat will probably be resolved but not be trying to keep it in a NATO structure that is steadily losing its *raison d'être*. So much is being written and discussed by experts on all sides about preserving NATO as a political consultative body, about folding Germany into the CSCE process, about NATO troops not being stationed in what is now East Germany. There seems to me to be a certain lack of reality at work in all those and other schemes. NATO, even as a consultative body, is and would remain a Western entity. Ergo, Germany's inclusion in it will be unacceptable to Mr. Gorbachev or to whoever is in power in Moscow. The CSCE is too unwieldy an institution as presently constituted to be able to assume a politico-economic security task. Most odd of the proposals for transitional arrangements, especially that which contemplates West Germany's paying to keep troops in West Germany for a number of years, strike me as unworkable if not nonsensical.

My own preliminary view is that some few years will be necessary to wind down conventional and nuclear forces in Europe. Some security structure for Europe must be found, if only as a large peace-keeping force to prevent miniwars from becoming big ones.

## WESTERN EUROPE AND ITS ROLE IN THE EAST

At present, West Germany is practically obsessed by the need to put East Germany on its feet economically. The sums of Deutschmarks required for that task will be enormous. This factor is leading the West Germans to review their position toward Eastern Europe. The general feeling in West German financial centers seems to be that there should be a division of the burden along the following lines: West Germany takes care of East Germany, the EC (absent the Federal Republic) deals with some countries of Eastern Europe, the U.S. should take care of what is left, and Japan should contribute huge sums to the area generally. Who takes care of the USSR is not viewed as a priority problem simply because the Soviet difficulties are so great that they defy the wit of the West to come up with any solutions. This division of labor will strike many in the West as selfish and narrowly German-focused in its consequences.

Whatever happens, however, it seems clear that the propping-up and future development of Eastern Europe into functioning economic entities are going to require a prolonged period, well beyond the year 2000. And during all those years of recovery, the health and welfare of the great bulk of Eastern European populations are going to suffer. One can expect even higher infant mortality rates, shorter life expectancy, poverty, crime, radicalization in the political processes and, without doubt, an environmentally deteriorating situation throughout the area. Eastern Europe is not going to be a happy or healthy place in the 1990's.

## BERLIN

The role of Berlin in this scheme of such new arrangements is a topic that also will not be easily or quickly resolved, although it need not be as complicated as the experts would have us believe. One could foresee a series of phases, beginning with a small, limited-diplomatic Four-Power presence in Great Berlin (a few thousand of persons per nation), moving on to a token quadripartite presence (a few hundred), then to an international status under UN auspices (with a token UN force). Even with these arrangements, Berlin will become again the capital of a unified Germany, one with no restrictions on its sovereignty. I am not speaking of generation for such a process but a period of some five to ten years, if not sooner.

I would assert that the 1990's will become known in future history books as the "Decade of Europe". The old continent has baffled the experts by throwing off its old ways of thinking about its problems, overcoming many historical burdens of the past, launching itself toward political and economic union, repairing the division of Europe and, in the process, making the superpowers fairly irrelevant in the scheme of European affairs.

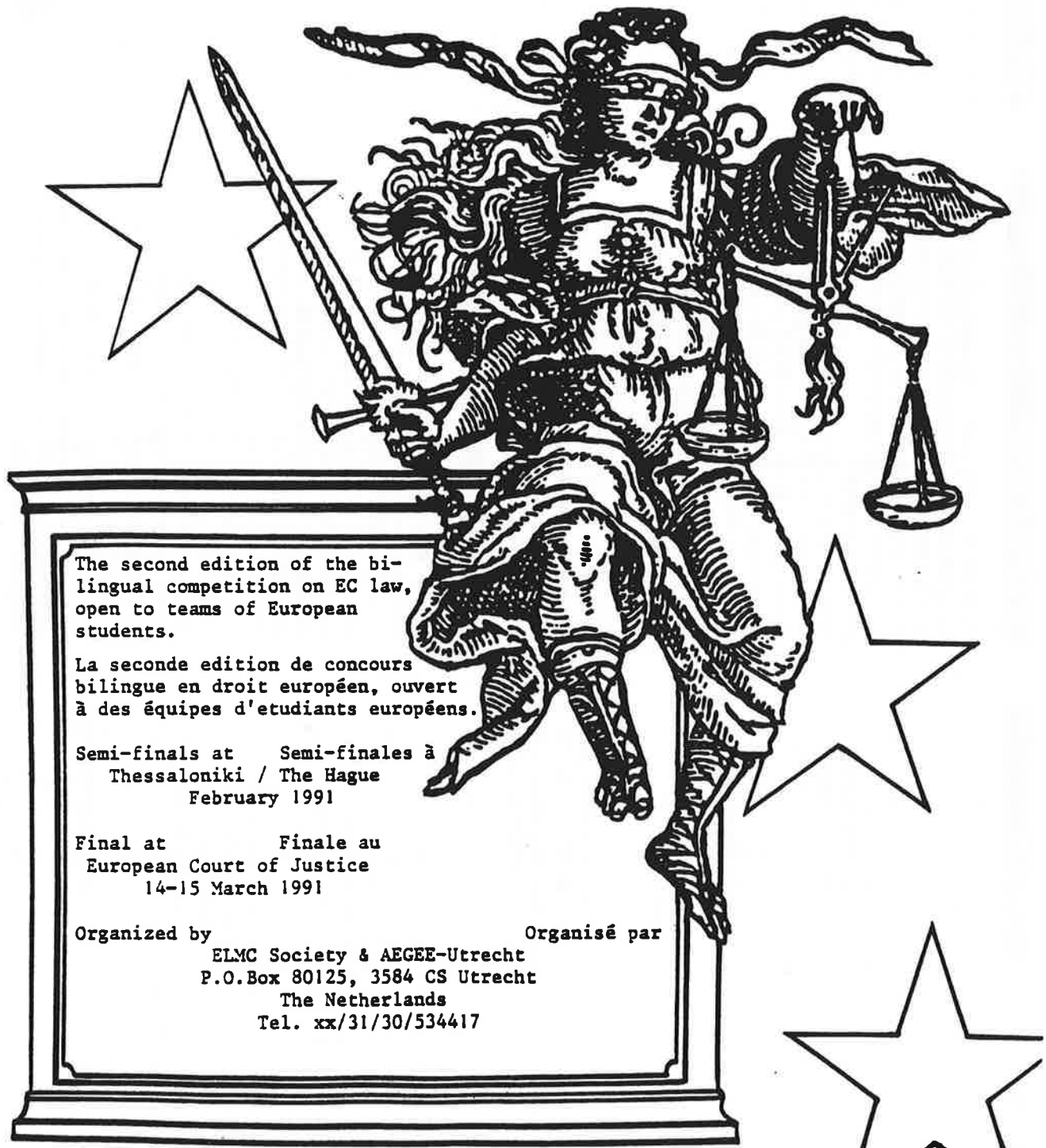

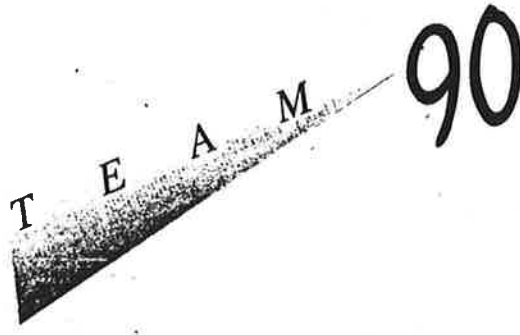

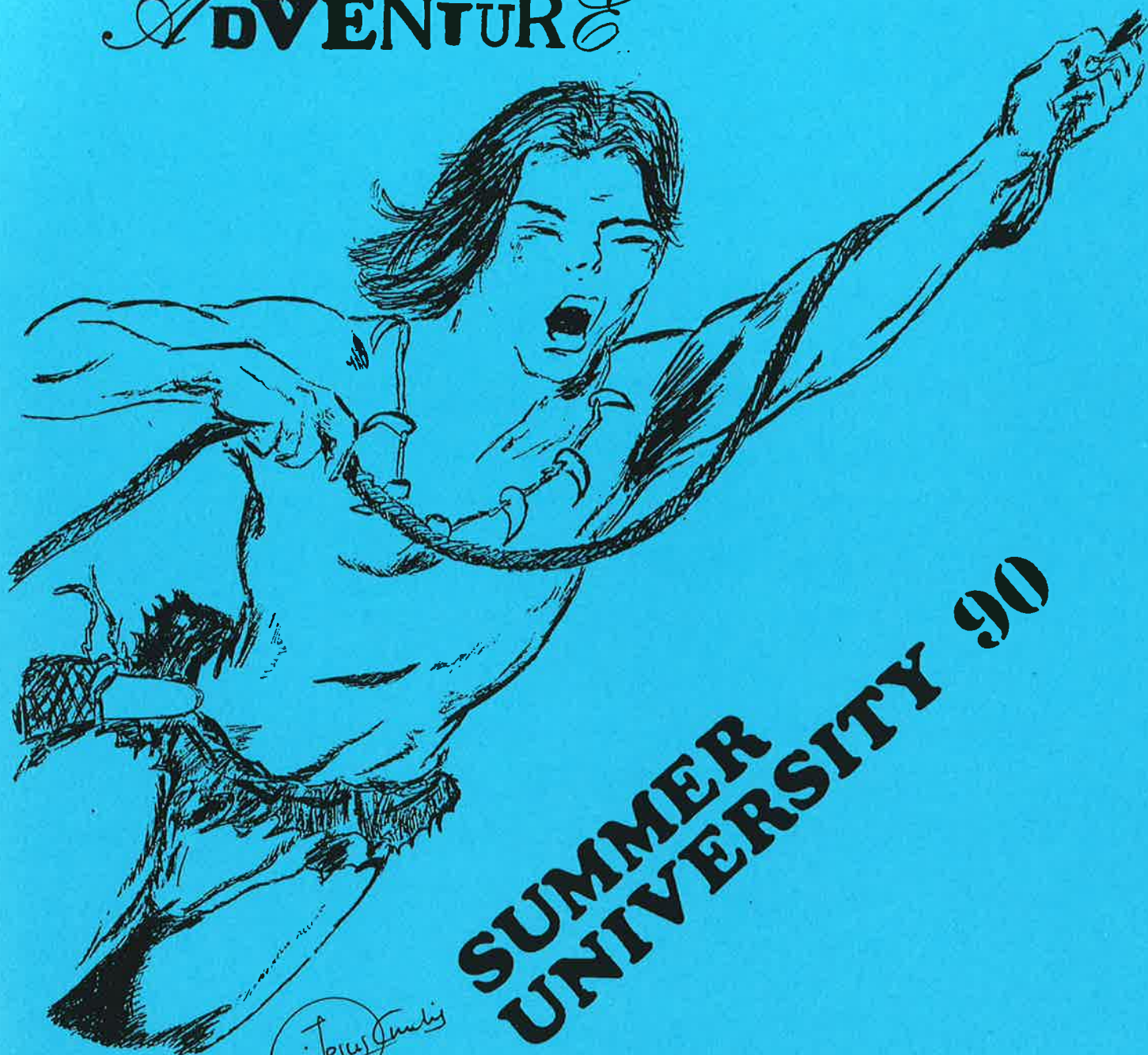
