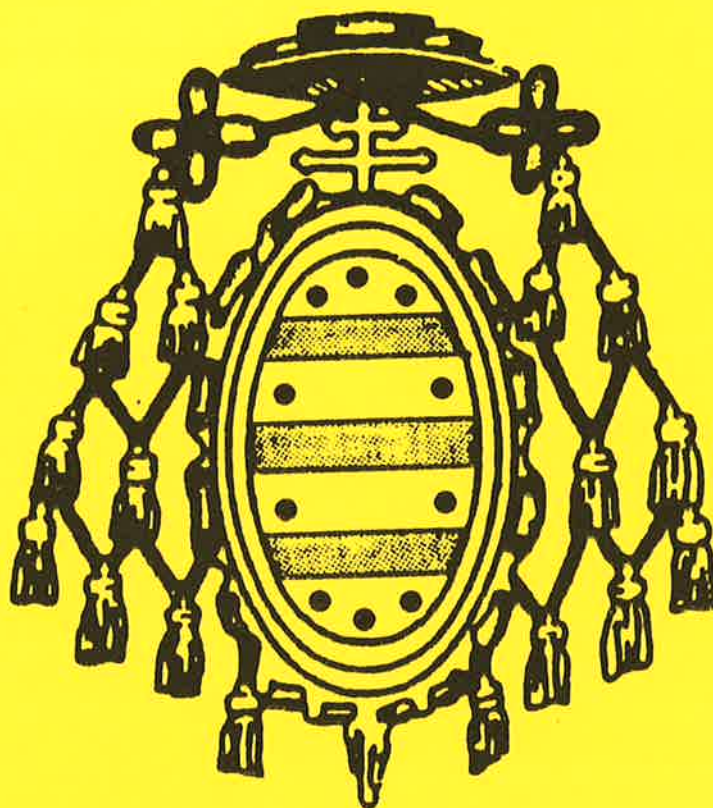

it's being long since the last time we wrote for you, but this time it is good news, so... We've already made 12 issues from Dec. '89. We began with only 300 copies and, in September '90 we jumped up to 450 but "What's New?" from now on we're making 1000 copies, just like we said in Bonn, though this isn't enough yet. 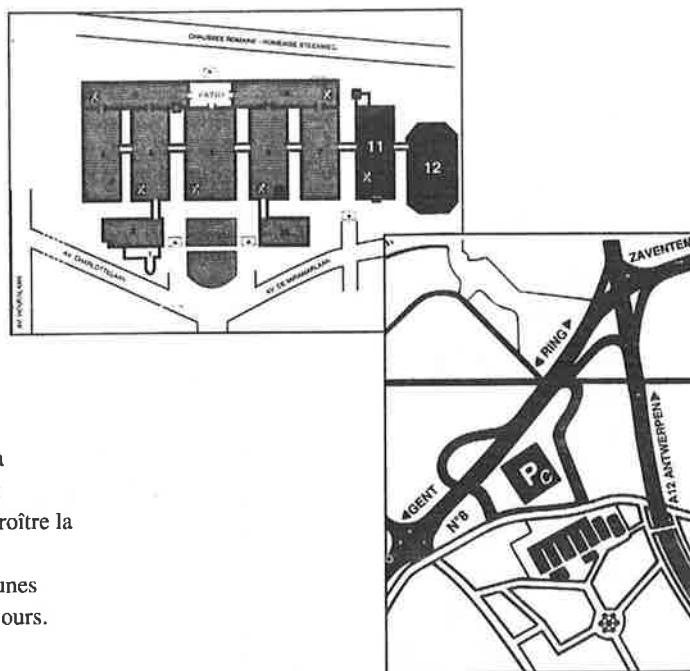

In February 1990, the 3rd Fair welcomed:

- 122.153 visitors, 10,000 of whom came from countries outside Belgium.
- 539 universities and institutions of higher and further education throughout Europe (232 institutions from other European countries outside Belgium and 307 Belgian institutions).

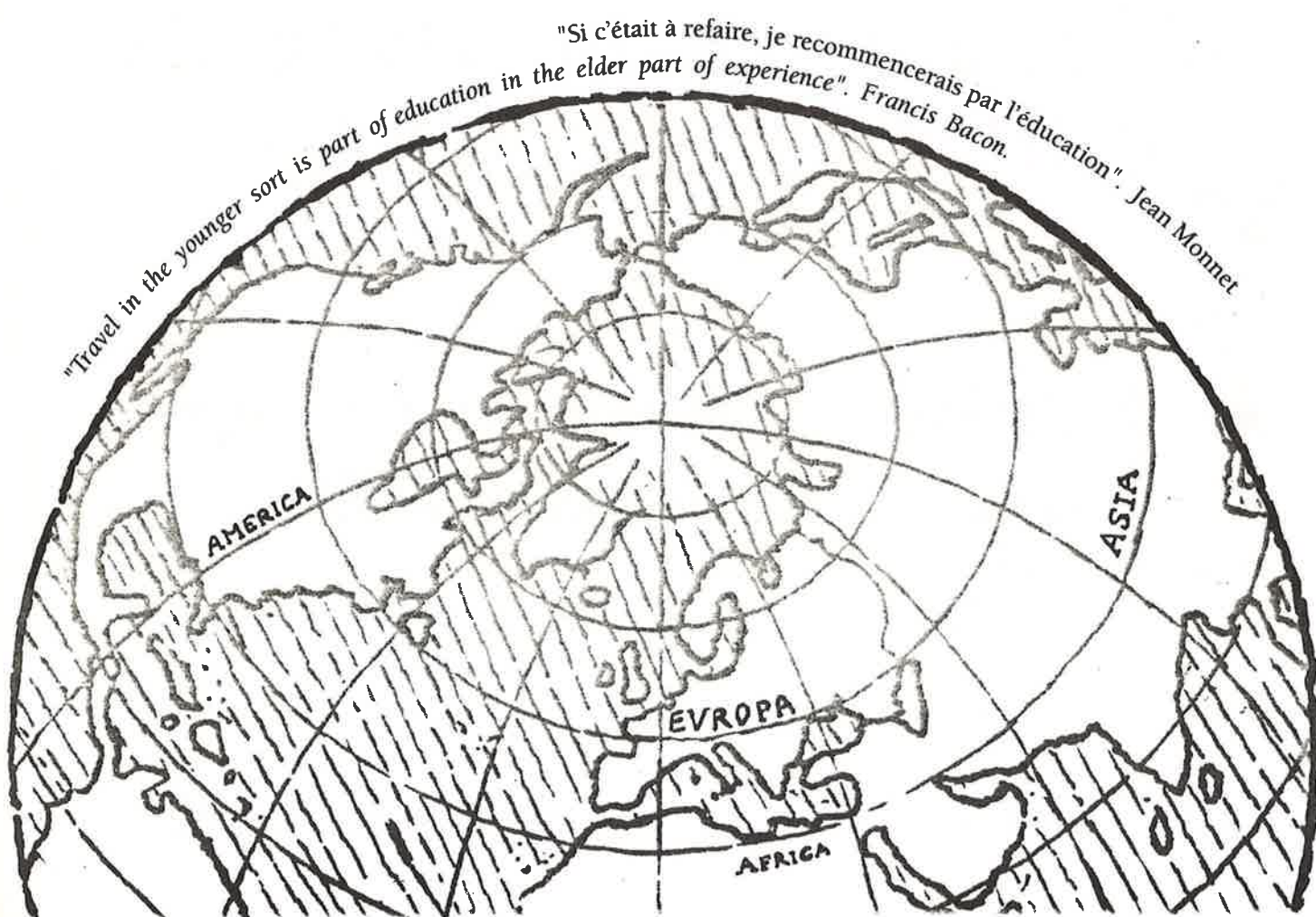
MEETING FORUM ON MOBILITY IN EUROPE

AEGEE—GUIDE OF EUROPEAN UNIVERSITIES

I Objective

Considering that most students do not even have a faint idea concerning the study conditions in other countries and studying abroad still means to cope with a lot of bureaucratic red tape and running around to get all necessary information, AEGEE intends to publish a "Study-Guide of European Universities" in order to give the European students concrete information about the social and academic conditions of studying at the particular European universities,

This "AEGEE-Guide of European Universities" is to contain study reports on all universities linked with the ERASMUS programme as well as detailed information on all bureaucratic and practical steps which are to be taken in order to go studying abroad. It is hoped that by this way many European students will be encouraged to cross the borders for a stay at another university and most ERASMUS students will face less problems and hardships in order to make their scholarships efficient.

II Action Plan

This AEGEE-Guide, which will be the first European university guide, is to focus on study reports written by ERASMUS students on their experiences studying abroad.

In addition general information is to be given on the city and the university. This means that each university is to be described by an article which should contain the following three parts:

- 1) a. The city: Some remarks on
 - history
 - sights
 - and other items which could be of interest for the students (such as night life)
- b. The university:
 - history of the university
 - library resources
 - computer facilities for students
 - structure of academic year
 - university system (e.g. structure of study, academic tuition, degree
 - exchange activities (just some figures such as how many foreign students? , how many
 - exchange projects? with which countries mainly? etc.)
 - grants for foreign students



2) Report by an ERASMUS student

This report should contain the personal experiences concerning the study stay abroad and should not only enumerate the following items, but also the suited for interesting the readers, i.e. by writing in quite a personal way:

- Enrollment requirements
- Residence permit
- Accommodation problems and how to solve them
- Language courses for foreign students
- Student services (how are the mensae and cafeteria at the university?)
- Leisure time activities at the university (sports, culture, student, clubs, etc.)

3) Important addresses, such as;

- University office for foreign students
- Secretary of the university
- Student Accommodation Service
- Mensae
- Foreign police
- Language Schools etc.
- and of course the address of the AEGEE antenna

N.B: Articles on the universities of Rome and Edinburgh are available, which may give you a concrete idea of how such an article should look like

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS

- 1) All articles should not be longer than 5 pages (A 4 size).
- 2) The articles should be written in English.
- 3) The articles should be sent either by disk (we are working with 'Macintosh' computers) or typed and show the name and address of the author and the antenna. It will not be possible to send proofs.
- 4) Please enclose a nice photo (black-white, if possible) from your university or your city!
- 5) The deadline is June 30th, 1991.

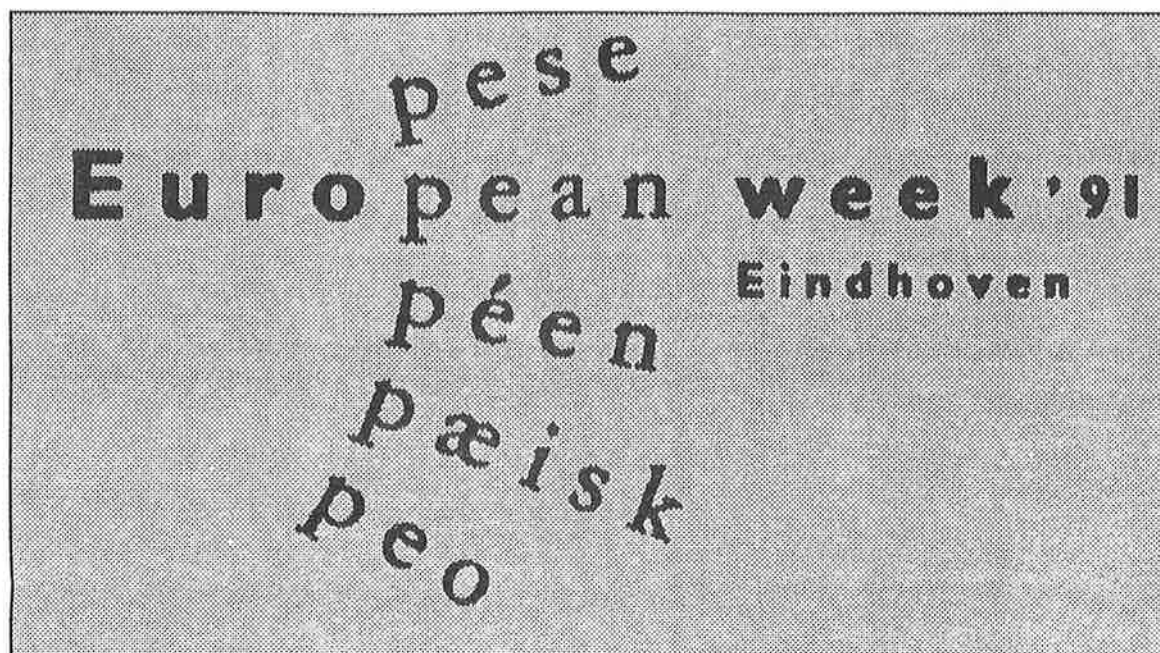

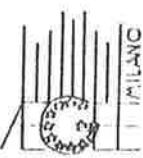

AEGEE Groningen presents
her second congress:
INTERNAL CORPORATE COMMUNICATION
February 21 and 22, 1991

Based on the great success and experience of our first congress titled "Is the future southward bound?", we decided to turn this happening into an annual event. In March, the six of us started brainstorming about possible subjects. Several talks with members of the university, the private sector and the public sector finally resulted in the following theme:

INTERNAL CORPORATE COMMUNICATION: 'Trends and developments due to organizational changes'

We will now try to give you an indication of what this subject is dealing with:

Without good communication between the members of a company, the company will be disorganized in no time. We will focus on three aspects of this corporate communication:

1. Communication and organizational structures;
2. Interpersonal communication;
3. Technological facilities to communicate.

The developments of these three aspects will be discussed. Main point is their influence on corporate communication.

1. Communication and organizational structures.

A trend is that organizations are flattening. The management chooses for short, direct communication channels. The resulting new organizational structure requires new means of communication.

2. Interpersonal communication.

The more common examples of this kind of communication are both orally and in writing. Less known are non-verbal (body language) and differences between male and female communication. Because of the information overflow people have to communicate more and more. One question that can be asked here is: "What are the consequences of this ever increasing communication for the employees?"

3. Technological facilities to communicate.

This aspect mainly deals with the means of communication. It is always important to consider which of them is to be used in different circumstances. A popular phrase here is: "Medium is the message". We will focus on the recent developments in this area e.g. telex, teleconferencing, and their practical application.

The congress will have a lot of variety. The lectures will be alternated with workshops, a panel discussion and excursions throughout our beautiful city. Of course we won't forget the informal part of the congress. Dinner by candlelight will be an outstanding opportunity to get acquainted with other members. This can be continued in the nice pubs on the first night and on the European party with live music on the last night.

Rotterdam, 4. 1. 1991

Dear Members of AEGEE,

On behalf of the whole Comité Directeur, I'd like to wish everyone of you, members of AEGEE, a very happy, healthy united and European new year 1991!

A year 1991, in which the world will face again the challenge of creating a more peaceful and democratic world to live in, respecting the rights of every human being.

And also within our "small world" of AEGEE, we will face in 1991 the same challenges of working together on our European scale.

The European scale in AEGEE, which has grown enormously the last year in especially our East-European neighbour countries.

We are glad to welcome them in West-Europe and also in our organization!

But also in the "older parts" of AEGEE, we still have to take up each time again, the challenge of working together on a European scale. What makes our AEGEE so special is exactly this fact of giving each single member the opportunity of meeting and working together with all those "different" cultures, present in AEGEE!

Therefore, I would like to ask every single member in every single AEGEE-Antenna to think about ideas and initiatives to bring this challenge into practice; within your antenna, working group, project, local board, commission or congress-organization!

Take the initiative and if you want help in any way, please do not hesitate to ask your local board and your Comité Directeur!

But let me also inform you all about the things happening in the CD and on this European level.

After the Agora in Bonn, at the end of November, we faced the difficulty to continue as a CD; especially getting all the information together was a hard thing to do. Only now, at the beginning of January, we are beginning to get an impression of how the actual situation is.

I mean, the actual situation in respect to finances, the contacts with the European Commission and with companies but also internally; which contacts are there to set up new antennae and who is in the new board of an antenna.

Next to this we tried, and still try to get in contact with local antennae, working groups, projects and so on. Not only to inform us about the actual situation, but also to listen and answer to their questions and to ask them where we, as the CD, can help them.

Because it's practically impossible to visit you all, I invite everyone of you to write us if you have any questions, remarks of whatever!

We are also working on the new projects and congresses, which will arise in AEGEE, such as the setting up of the Database, Summer university 1991, TEAM '91, The Space-congress, the EGEE VII Energy Congress and the ERASMUS-program. Mostly, it's a matter of coordination, stimulation and concrete helping e.g. in contacting the European Community.

Very important is of course also the concern about the development of AEGEE in France and Belgium and the settlement of an AEGEE-Head Office in Brussels.

In respect to Belgium, we are planning to have an AEGEE-stand at the European Student Fair, 19-23 March in Brussels and also we are planning to organize a "Tour de Belgique", to visit the contacts we have in each university-town and to organize an information-evening for interested students.

In respect of France, the situation of AEGEE is quite bad, we are first trying to help the existing small antennae and thinking about taking part in the fairs organized by the magazine "L'Etudiant".

In respect to the head office in Brussels, we are taking concrete steps to investigate the possibility of renting a bureau there.

Let me end by asking you a few concrete things;

1. Because we want to put more local activities on the Calendar of Events, I want to ask every antenna to please send me all the needed information, e.g. your local news bulletins, as the CD we would like to be as well informed as possible, about what is going on in AEGEE, so maybe you can add the CD, in concrete my address, to your members' list.

2. The function of the News Bulletin will be more important for all the internal AEGEE-news, including the information from the CD. So I would like to ask you all to read carefully the monthly edition of our News Bulletin and also to send more information and articles to the NB.

Now the amount printed is increased from 450 to 100 copies, so each antenna will also receive more copies! Please distribute them among your members or publish the information in your local newsletter.

Now also advertisements can be published in the NB, so if you know a company. . .

And also we are thinking about setting up a team of correspondents throughout whole AEGEE, writing for the NB; so if you are interested, please contact Maria in Oviedo.

3. In order to increase the awareness of the AEGEE-members, I offer the willingness of the CD to come to your antenna (or other AEGEE-organization) and to present, discuss and talk about especially AEGEE-Europe. Maybe after your local members-assembly or just as a local activity, can it bring the European dimension of our organization more direct to all the members, we think.

If your antenna is interested, don't hesitate to contact us.

4. I want to invite you all to the Presidents' Conference, which will be held the 23rd and 24th of February in Groningen, and to the next Agora, which will be held the 27th and 28th of April in Amsterdam.

You will get in advance all the needed information, but please hold these dates already free in your agenda!

As I hope, we informed you about the challenges you can take up within AEGEE in this new year! Let's meet on the concrete activities!

Dear Antennae,

Of course we need your cooperation in achieving the presented ideas in solving the many problems AEGEE is facing. Therefore I would like to ask for your attention and your reactions concerning the following points:

1. Important addresses

The key point of our AEGEE-network is the address book. We want to keep it as up-to-date as possible and therefore we want to realize a new one. February seems the right time, because a lot of new boards will have been elected in this period. It has been produced in February before. It would be very kind if you can send me your important addresses concerning:

- list of the board members and their functions

- names of your working group and project responsables

- address, telephone and fax of your office (if you do not have a fax, please give us a fax-number where you can receive faxes).

please send me this information by 30th January 1991 and also every change of your important addresses.

I want to thank Dorothea Heister for having taken care of the address book in the past. Also I would like to ask the antennae to take on the responsibility of the important addresses in the future especially to the antennae that have got the possibility of free printing and mailing; I would request as well to those antennae that have got this possibility to let us know as it is useful for everybody.

2. Development problems

One of our main goals is the development of AEGEE in those European countries where AEGEE is not present enough or not at all. I think the idea of development united both policies, first to help antennae, which have important problems in their work, and second to establish new antennae.

Another good experience, what I made concerning of helping to a weak antenna, was the representation of AEGEE as a kind of a lecture in Budapest. Before it took place, we invited our Hungarian contact persons to the EWWG-meeting held in Leipzig on 14th, 15th July last year, who were willing and able to work for the idea of AEGEE. They carried out a good advertising campaign on the Budapest Universities with PR-material given by AEGEE members like EWWG-material or the Karlsruhe-brochure. Then they organized a university hall to introduce AEGEE, that's why we (17 members from different antennae) were invited with that purpose. It was well prepared by them, 150 students filled the hall. Everybody of us took one part in these representation, it was like a lecture and we had to answer to many questions. I think these kind of presentation expresses our strength - students dealing with various subjects and coming from different countries showed one common idea - the European integration. Now you can count there a real working antenna with about 60 students. Such a presentation can be one possibility to help antennae, which have important working problems or those which are on the beginning. I believe that we can carry out such kinds of lectures elsewhere in Europe, considering the special situation on the several university towns with a good coordination between the antennae, the working groups and the CD. Please be so kind and write me your opinion about this and certainly all your ideas, how we can support together weak antennae and establish new ones.

So I'm looking forward to your letters and in advance I want to thank you for sending me all your important addresses and your imaginations about the below told development problems. I believe that we can only solve our problems together, that's why we need everybody, especially you.
