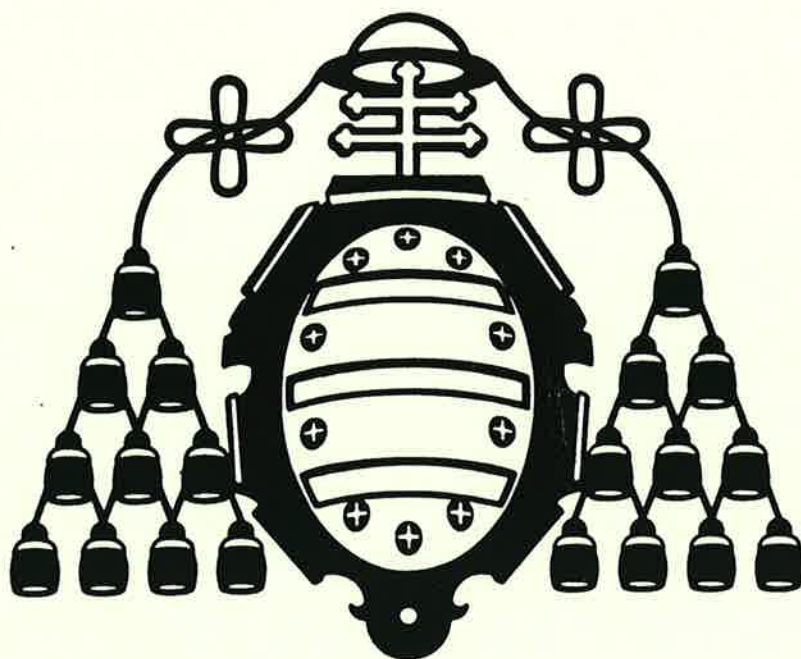

Summer time is high time for AEGEE. This year almost 1000 AEGEE members will meet and learn "somewhere in Europe" at any of the many different Summer Universities. This is time for meeting new people and also for talking and discussing about AEGEE and its future. For making new contacts and brotherships (as AEGEE-Athina and AEGEE-Oviedo will). Discussion, anyway, is necessary since in November we will have our Agora in Budapest. This one will be crucial for the future of our AEGEE, since it will be the first time we will use the new system of election; a good system, though it's not so nice that in it we mention the only forbidden word in AEGEE: nationality (nation, country ...). EAST WEST WORKING GROUP REPORT

The East-West WG had their second meeting this year, this time in Utrecht, Holland. Participants from Hungary, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Germany, England joined this succesful meeting in May.

Six Students from Debrecen, Hungary, were invited a week earlier to visit their sister-antenna in Hungary. After having organized a perfect prgramme in their beautiful hometown in Eastern Hungary last April they were now able to discover Holland. AEGEE-Utrecht offered them the possibility to see how a full-grown antenna works. Besides this informative part there was enough time for European integration (!).

The EW WG strongly supports this kind of inter-AEGEE relationships. We invite other antennae to follow the examples set by AEGEE-Utrecht and of course AEGEE-Freiburg, that set up AEGEE-Pécs and AEGEE-Prague in one big project. If antennae are interested in setting up such a sister antenna project, please do contact us (the EW WG Board) for better coordination and information. Soon we will present a booklet with useful guidelines and examples for the foundation of antennae in the East. The EWVG supports the policy of quality over quantity that means we want to guarantee quality antennae with lots of enthusiastic people with continous motivation and participation in AEGEE.

TEAM 90 gave the opportunity to students and new graduates from all over Europe and from different courses to get in touch directly with a group of companies in order to check their career opportunities in the Common Market.

TEAM 90 was sponsored by Agip, Enel, Nielsen and Olivetti, together with Agusta, Banco di Roma, Barilla, Booz-hallen and Hamilton, Bosch, Bracco, Colgate, Credito Italiano, CSELT, Deutsche Bank, Dolma, Ferruzzi, Fininvest, ICI, italgas, Italtel, KPMG Peat Marwick, Nuova Magrini Galileo, RAS, SEAT, SIP, Sipra, Stet, Telespazio, Telettra and UAP. Furthermore SDA Bocconi, Groupe ESC Lyon, INSEAD, MIP Politecnico Milano and SINNEA were present to give information about their graduate courses.

This year TEAM 91 will take place again in Milano, on December 2-5, 1991.

We want TEAM 91 to be more than a recruitment fair, and much more than an AEGEE Europe event organized only by one antenna. We are sure that we cannot reach the level of quality we wish without the involvement of all the antennae, and without the practical and strong support of at least a good number of them.

We want TEAM 91 to be present as many foreign companies as possible, and we want to receive the largest possible number of applications from the students in order to show that it is true that inside AEGEE there is an extremely interested audience for such topics as euromanagers and international careers.

We want other antennae to share the burden, the pleasures and the profits arising from this event, and possibly to spread all the know-how we have gathered in organizing TEAM 90 and part of TEAM 91.

For these reasons, we will strongly support any antenna that has the will and the ability to contact companies in its own country. A forfait "reimbursement" of 700 ECUs will be provided for each company that you manage to have at TEAM 91. This amount, which is far more than the profit earned on a single company in TEAM 91, is intended as a stimulus to working hard and efficiently. We are at your disposal for further information and for presentation material. Please use the fax to get in touch with us: 39 2 58362000 attn. AEGEE-TEAM 91. You should indicate us which companies you wish to contact, and where; companies should sign the TEAM 91 contract by mid September.

All antennae are invited to promote as strongly as possible TEAM 91. As it is obvious that we try to promote this event as much as possible, it is true as well that TEAM 91 can be a very attractive way to promote your antenna among the students in your town. A European Special Issue by Il Sole 24 Ore and Depliant will be sent throughout Europe at all important meetings.

Furthermore, to spread over Europe the know-how gathered in a 250.000 ECU event, which has involved cooperating with the largest financial newspaper as copies sold in Europe, hosting and managing 500 guests, organizing a fair with 30 exhibitors and promotion, selection and contacts at a really European level, we plan to organize a study camp of one week in late September for those who wish to learn how it worked, what went wrong and how it could have worked better. Applications should be sent in by July 15th to AEGEE-Milano - TEAM 91 Study Camp. Please write it exactly like that if you don't want to be confused with applicant for TEAM 91. Please also enclose a short summary of our experience in organizing events. Note that we want only Very Motivated Candidates: the week will be quite intensive and attending classes is compulsory.

We hope that TEAM 91 will have the same success of the first edition. We rely on you for this, and we are sure that we are in good hands. See you in Europe. See you in Milano: December, 3-5 Palazzo delle Stelline.

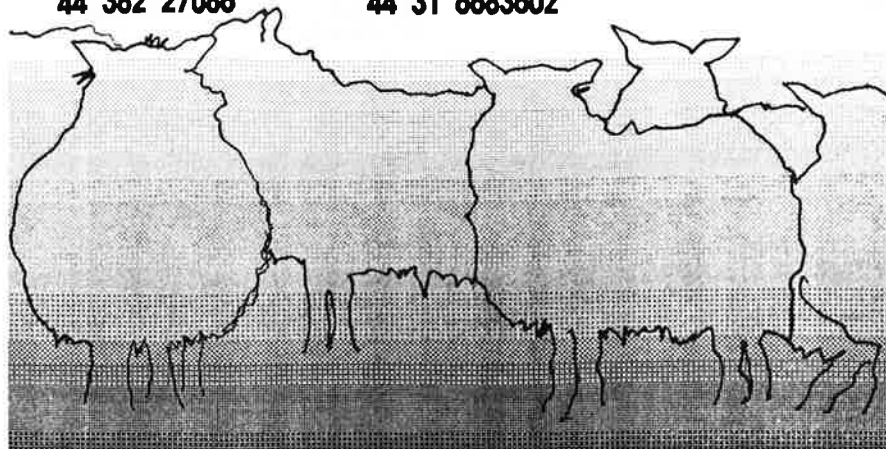

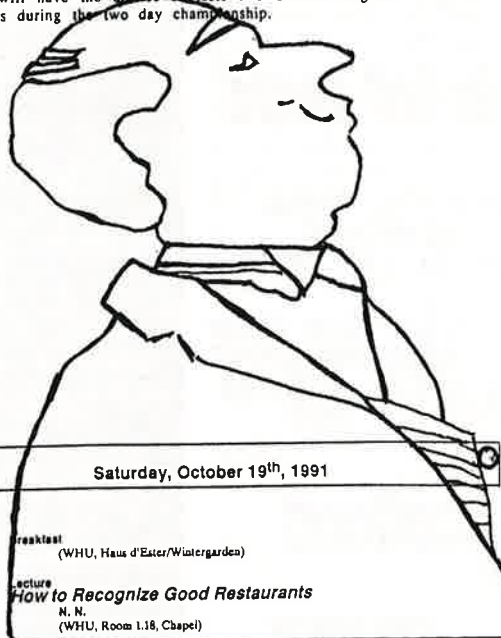
8 international teams will compete against each other. Each team consists of 8 members. The groups will name representatives for the following jobs:

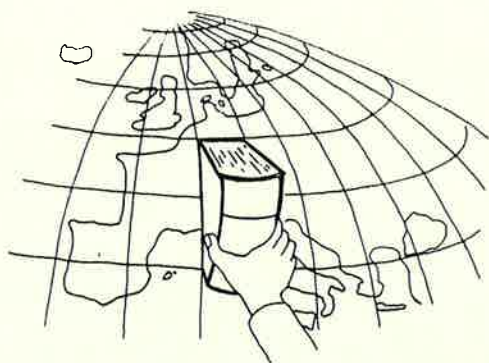
