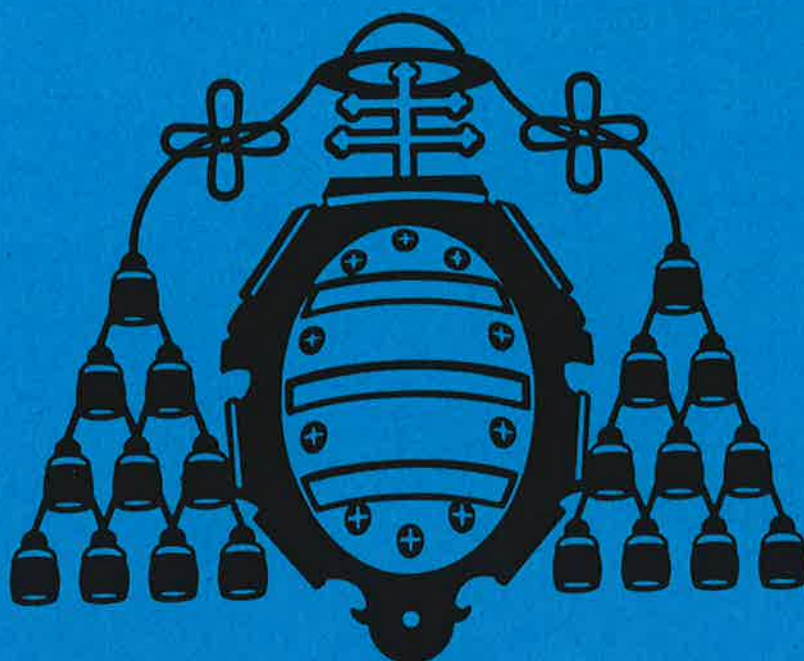

We decided to look for a coordinator for the Universities Guide since those sent more reports enough. Peter Simon will prepare a Yearbook, including presentation of the activities for 1992, as a global programme for that year. It will be ready for the Spring Time Life Magazine. They are trying to publish a cooperation with a group (or something similar) of people with a special interest in journalism. Therefore it would be useful to create a working group through the association. They visited 5 Scandinavian towns, with quite good results. If you have any contacts in the University towns, please send them the addresses. The TEMPUS Team is already working. Informations: Michael Merker or at the congress in Hamburg.

At the last CD-Meeting in Bordeaux, Peter Simon presented a letter to the Commission that was ment as a frame-work paper for developing a declaration on AEGEE concerning the situation in Yugoslavia and the response of the European Institutions to that conflict. Since some of us represent the feelings of the members of AEGEE till that point we decided on organizing a round table on the subject of Budapest. Our participation is necessary since it's not restricted to the Yugoslavian conflict but also to the role of AEGEE as "theoretical" representatives of all the students in Europe, and the relevance and pertinence of an "AEGEE-opinion". That is why we want to encourage you to participate in this debate and put your opinions on the table to be discussed.

The next CD meeting will take place in Budapest, just before what we expect to be one of the bests AGORAs we have ever had. Some of the subjects we will touch there are the following:

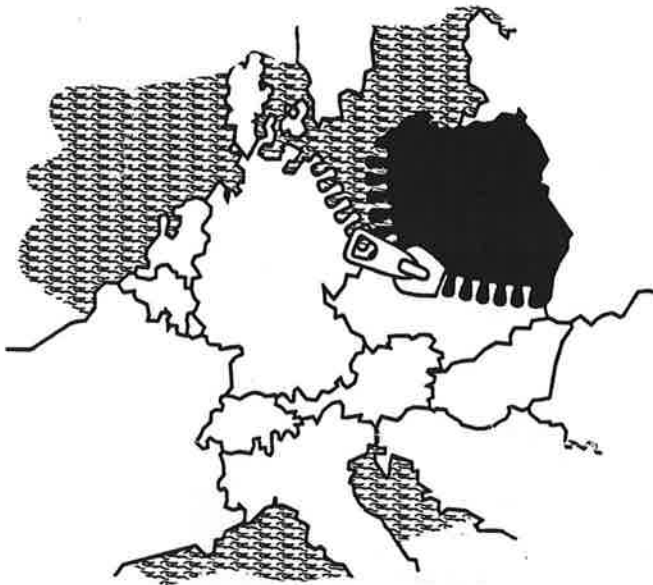

Why are we having this congress?

AEGEE-members can hardly ignore that since more than one
year a certain phenomenon has become more and more
evident. That is the increasing active participation of East
European students in AEGEE-events. The acceptance and
integration of our East European partners in our organization as
well as into the European Community, is one of the biggest
challenges AEGEE has ever been confronted with. Like in 1985,
as AEGEE has done it's very best to promote the image of the
Common European House in Western Europe, AEGEE now has
to take over the leadership in the co-operation with Eastern
Europe. In this context we will consider during the congress the
existing (political, economical and cultural) relations between
Poland and the EC, whilst also dealing with the question of how
to improve these relations. Our purpose is to show the common
fundamentals of Western and Eastern Europe (using the
example of Poland) and to demonstrate the necessity of a
stronger co-operation. Nevertheless, the critics of a too fast
east-west integration will have the opportunity to give their
statement. Beside the speeches of the invited speakers, the
congress will offer the participants the opportunity to get to know
something about Polish culture and lifestyle.

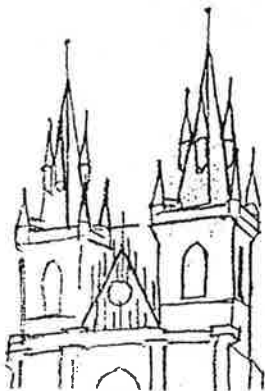
Task definitions:

1. To promote the use of the Net, increasing the number of antennae connected. As the
use of the Net is free and it can be used in most of the European Universities, the
Association would save, at least, a 25% of the actual expenses in communication.
2. To help other antennae which want to get an account and use it. We can send those
antennae some information about the responsible for the Net in their universities, where to
ask for an account, and how to start to work with it (it is very easy).
3. To coordinate the use of the Net with some rules. Those rules must avoid that the
members working in the Net loose their time sending messages to a disconnected account.
Those rules must also contain an electoral system to choose a coordinator.

Rules: (proposal)

- In every connected antenna there must be an EARN-responsible and an EARN Local
Working Group. The optimum number of members for this group is of five or six people.
- The EARN Responsible is member of the EARN W.G., the members of the EARN-LWG
will also be members of the EARN W.G., if they ask for it in "note" form.
- Every last week of every month, the EARN-responsible must send a message to the
EARN coordinator which confirm they continue active in the Net. They will receive a list of
the antennae still connected at the beginning of the following month.
- There should be a FORM that the EARN responsible must send twice a year (two
weeks before the Agora) to the coordinator, this FORM will reach information about the Net
to be presented at the Agora.
- Once a year, at the EARN W.G. meeting before the Agora of April, the members of the
Group must democratically elect who will be the Coordinator during the following year.

ANNUAL MEETING OF LES ANCIENS D'AEGEE-EUROPE LONDON, OCTOBER 1991 "EUROPE 2000+" - IMPRESSION -

Les Anciens d'AEGEE-Europe are a group of people who were active for AEGEE-Europe in the past. They meet once every year. The last meeting was held in London in the weekend of October, 19 and 20 1991.

Present were: Franc Biancheri, Andrew Oldland, Tim Rogmans, Johannes Heister, Job Woerst, Klaas de Boer, PH. Portalier, Pierre Blanc, M. Dietrich. From the current CD: Georg von der Gablentz, Michael Merker, Oliver Drewes.

The topic of this year's meeting was "Europe 2000+". The meeting started with a presentation of the current activities of LES ANCIENS and the other participants. This was followed by a statement of Franc Biancheri: "Ready to accommodate Eastern Europe?" - What the Community must do now and until the year 2000". Georg von der Gablentz (President of AEGEE-Europe) continued the meeting with his speech: "The prospect of a greater Europe - How does it fit into AEGEE-Europe's strategy and policy?"

A quite interesting discussion, focussed on different ways to cope with the problems and challenges of AEGEE, closed the meeting. Essential for the whole meeting was the friendly atmosphere and the openness between all participants. Franc explained his views on the current developments in Europe. He stressed the importance of setting dates for the possible joining to the Community of Hungary, Poland, Czechoslovakia and Rumania. This would be the only possibility for social stability in both the East and West. Politicians are currently running behind all developments. According to some "Anciens" there is a lack of vision. Student organizations like AEGEE could force them to develop good strategies by showing them alternatives for the actual policies, marked by a lack of coherence. Would this attitude not make a political organization out of AEGEE? One should consider that the idea of European integration has a political impact from the very beginning. In the eyes of some "Anciens" AEGEE should be very "aggressive" to reach the aims. Are there still new ideas, or is AEGEE simply a travel organization aimed at giving students good time abroad? This is one of the crucial points. At least it is obvious that many former AEGEE members are still very interested in the well being of AEGEE. This background support could be very positive for AEGEE. Old members do not want to be policymakers, but their experience and advice can be very useful. We should take care of them!

LETTER

I was happy to read the editorial of María J. Alvarez in the September edition of the News Bulletin. It was about the thought of putting politics and AEGEE together and whether those two would match or not. In the first part María pointed out that "mental activity" concerning the ideas of our organisation has yielded to practical matters such as calendars of events, proposals for future meetings etc. I think that it is time to take up the discussion about the philosophy of AEGEE and I hope that María's article encouraged some people to follow the example. I would like to contribute some thoughts to a "flaming up" of such a discussion. As I am a rather young member of AEGEE, I don't know which black periods in the past might be the background to the reserved attitude towards politics that seemed to be expressed between the lines. But whatever the reason might be, there is no reason to reject certain duties and even responsibilities. A European organisation that wants to contribute something to a peaceful European and even wider community has to confront itself with political matters. Those political matters have to be discussed and we have to articulate our attitudes to what is going on in Europe. Saying that the political factor of AEGEE has to be limited to "the art of living in a Community" is -if taken seriously- a very challenging task that requires a lot of energy steadiness and the will to fight for one's proper ideas. I think that the fact that wars in which a lot of people get killed without any reason can still take place in Europe and are something very real in our days (see Yugoslavia) obliges us to think our position over and to express it, too. Or do we want to be nothing more than a nice bunch of people who travel around Europe but close their eyes before the problems that lie in front of their feet?

Conclusions of the Regional Meeting Held in Berlin 28-29 September

1. Participants

guests from AEGEE-Praha, Warszawa, Poznan, AEGEE-Budapest and Moscow wanted to take part, but unfortunately they could not due to study- and visaproblems, guests from AEGEE-Amsterdam, Maastricht, Turku, Leipzig, Bonn, Hamburg, Köln, Berlin, furthermore Marc Coumans, Secretary of the EWWG and of course our President of AEGEE-Europe Georg von der Gablentz.

2. Aim of the meeting:

We want to stimulate with this meeting the cooperation between eastern and western antennae. In reality we can only count 2 cooperation projects: 1. the Agorá in Budapest; AEGEE-Europe with Budapest, 2. the congress in Hamburg: Poland and the EC; AEGEE-Hamburg with Krakow, Warszawa, Wrocław.

Of course we need more of such cooperations not only due to the TEMPUS matters. In the beginning we established antennae in East-Europe, now we have to take care of them that they survive.

A possible way to reach those things are such meetings, there you can discuss about:

- the necessary exchange of experiences
- plans for future projects
- you have the time to talk in a little group about ideas - a real brainstorming
- possibilities of working together and then
- concrete measures

3. Speciality of this meeting:

Certainly it was the first one of those kind and on course you will not have after the first one ready congresses, which you can announce.

Important was that so many interested people took part and that we found a frame where such cooperation meetings can take place.

Of course next time should take the EWWG with other antennae the responsibility to create such a meeting.

Next time we will meet at the EWWG meeting held in Debrecen from the 1. to 4. November 91. The EWWG should be the right institution to stimulate the cooperation, but they were inside some organizational difficulties, that is why we made this.

4. Results of the meeting

4.1 TEMPUS

We had an introduction and explanation of the new TEMPUS program VADEMECUM all the details which are important for AEGEE concerning TEMPUS can be found in a special letter to every antenna from Michael Merker. We founded a TEMPUS-Team, consisting of Jörg Westphal (Hamburg), Kike (Oviedo), Jiri from Praha, Petra Jakobsen (Budapest) and myself Michael.

What is the task of this TEMPUS Team?

1. The people are responsible for the collection of the information concerning TEMPUS.
2. They should give advice to the antennae about the application.
3. They should help to work the AEGEE TEMPUS applications

If you are interested you can join us, we will announce it on the PM and Agorá.

Short timetable for procedure of the application to the 31.12.91 (more details also in the TEMPUS letter)

- stimulation of thinking about projects for the academical year 92/93
 - EWWG meeting in Debrecen from the 1. to 4. November, a good place for help for some projects and brainstorming
 - Hamburg congress working out of the application with detailed plans and budget
- Of course we cannot make an application for TEMPUS without projects, so we need your ideas.

On the other hand you can apply via the CD at the EC, if you present your project half a year before it takes place.

Another possibility for subventions is the Council of Europe, but the amount you can get is lower than from the EC.

4.2 Ideas for projects:

In general we thought it is very important for the next time the topic "European Citizenship" What is a European? Where are the borders? I think that it is not only remarkable for the people from East-Europe also for the people from the West.

1. AEGEE-Europe congress about Poland's future in Europe

AEGEE-Poznan is organizing a seminar from the 6.-8. December about "Future of Europe - Future of Poland". AEGEE-Hamburg, Warszawa, Krakow, Wrocław are organizing in Hamburg from the 11.-14. December a congress concerning "EC and Poland"

They want to use the results and experiences to establish an AEGEE-Europe congress concerning Poland's relation in the common Europe in October/November 92. Thereby more western antennae should be involved, place of the congress should be Poland.

2. Official AEGEE trip to Poland

Ludger Dauwe (AEGEE-Bonn) wants to care about an official AEGEE trip to Poland and a Budapest model-AEGEE members from different antennae should stimulate our idea. Ludger is thinking of the time around the New Years Day.

3. Presidents' Meeting (PM)

Due to their good cooperation AEGEE-Warszawa, Krakow, Wrocław are able to organize a PM in the next year.

4. Summer Universities (SU)

Next year it should take place in every eastern antenna. AEGEE-Praha told their experiences, that language courses in Czechs are not so interesting for the majority. That is why they want to make next year a course more about cultural, political, historical problems of their own country. It can be for everybody a good introduction of the special country. They think that also other antennae could do it.

5. Boattrip of AEGEE-Moscow

They are planning a Europe wide boattrip, connecting all the countries between St. Petersburg and London.

6. TEMPUS academy

We are thinking to have a TEMPUS academy in one of our East European antenna. It should be similar to our ERASMUS Academies.

4.3 EWWG

In this time we are watching the third etappe in the EWWG. In the beginning it was a discussion club about the topic East Europe and the EWWG was working on the content and created East-West congresses.

After the fall of the wall was the EWWG the motor of the foundation of antennae in the East.

Now it changes and this process cannot go without difficulties.

- The EWWG should take care now about the situation of the Eastern antennae. It has inside the potential of the willing and interested people to do the job.

- The members could stimulate partnerships between western and eastern antennae, some of them should be responsible for a special antenna.

- The EWWG must be the basic element for the information about the specific problems in our eastern antennae. They should play better their AEGEE-Europe WG role as an advisor of the CD and the antennae about their special topic.

- Of course they can work on the content East-West in the future time.

- Very important is that the EWWG should organize such cooperation meetings as this one in Berlin. The EWWG can and should be the institution, which helps the Eastern antennae, because the economical situation will not increase so fast - there will be problems for longer time, which of course we can try to help to overcome.

Now many people are interested in East European affairs but it can change, that's why we need therefore a functioning institution - the EWWG.

4.4 Information flow

Since June of this year every antenna, contactantenna and contact, receives a monthly CD letter called Dispatch. It includes everytime the AEGEE news, which are very important for our eastern antennae and an updated calendar of events (very important for visa applications). I am responsible for this and if you have sometimes special information, which I can include, please send it to me.

Of course, we are open for every improvement.

The EWWG should take care of the special information flow from Eastern antennae to the CD, that the CD is informed and can help them.

Also important is that all antennae announce in time their events to the Secretary General of AEGEE-Europe, that he can plan the Calendar of Events better and that we don't have 4 events at the same time.

An own Operator's Manual (OpM) for the eastern antennae can be created, if the main OpM is finished for the next Agorá.

The EWWG will publish next time an own booklet (a representation of itself and its work)

This was our first meeting to talk about cooperation between eastern and western antennae. We will meet again on the EWWG meeting in Debrecen 1.-4. November. I want to thank everybody who took part. Also I want to thank the members of AEGEE-Berlin, namely Carsten Meyer, who helped totally to organize this meeting.

Discussing the open letter annexed, the CD decided in its last meeting in Bordeaux to have an open discussion. Its aim is to define the political role and the voice AEGEE should raise in the future, especially in cases of the structures and activities of an integrating Europe. Discussing this point, we have to remember some rules and basis we gave ourselves

-First of all, we are a European students organization, aiming to develop the integration towards Europe. Is this giving us the right to pronounce our opinion in questions of big policy?
-Next, we are a European students organization. That's why we should concentrate on the promotion of students' interest. But what are the interests of students? Only studies, or furthermore the situation in their sociopolitical environment?
-And finally, we are a European students organization. This on the one hand side offers the possibility to speak with the voice of thousands of members. But on the other side, will we give the right to speak in the name of AEGEE to the CD? Of course this is a group of engaged and experienced people, and they discuss subjects controversially. But do they reflect the opinion of the major part of the members? (I hope so ...)

So far, the discussion will take the following way:
In an introductory speech we will have some information about the past activities of AEGEE in this field of interest. After that, I like to have two "lawyers of position". Each one should take one position and give a short statement (max. 5 min.). After that we are starting an analytical discussion, touching at least the following points:

- aims of AEGEE
- the role of students in the society: critical innovator or idealistic fool
- extraparlamentary politics: lobbying, work at the basis or ...?
- competence

At the end I hope to have a result paper which should be taken into the Agorá. If you have interest taking part in this discussion as a "lawyer", please contact me. In any case you should state your interest in your application form for the Agorá. Looking forward discussing you

 - The EC takes minutes in a conflict without using its powerful situation, reflecting exactly its inner structure of cooperating nations - far away from a possible integrated policy.
- That's why we feel ashamed when we face people from Slovenia and Croatia. Not recognizing the right of self-determination means staying in the old scheme of the Europe of the Nations. And here you find the core of many problems occurring in the Europe of today.

We as the youth of Europe asking ourselves about the how of a future structure of the community. Striving towards a "union of the people" the idea of a "Europe of the Regions" is indispensable. Why?

In our times the values of the people are mainly fixed by their roots - which they find in their tribes. This way you find the natural borders between regions in Europe.

This is the legitimation for a stronger federalism. The voice of national governments as the present power centres, a strong parliament as the future main legislative body and a possible participation of regions in their special field of interest offers a system based on three legs. And like you know, a chair with three legs cannot tip; but it can be useless if one leg is extremely short.

That's why we should recognize this movement towards autonomy. Europe can only be built when people are willing to contribute, and if they see advantages for themselves.

Please force the building of Europe nearby the people - and not somewhere in the blue sky over Bruxelles.

1. Presidents Meeting (PM)

From the 11.-13. October our PM took place. For the AEGEE development was one from the CD suggested and from the antennae accepted proposal concerning more clear defined antennae criteria remarkable. The Agorá must now accept the proposal.

Following criteria must be fulfilled from a contactantenna to achieve the antenna-status:

1. must have paid the membership fees
2. has to attend on PM and Agorá
3. has to organize a European event; it can be a congress, an academy, a summer university, an Agorá, a PM, a regional meeting.

The criteria to become a contactantenna are remaining.

So you have to give us:

1. a memberslist (at least 10 members)
2. your statutes which must belong to the AEGEE-Europe statutes (you should be registered at your town court)
3. a presentation of your future activities

After this you can sign officially in front of an Agorá or a PM the convention d'adhesion.

So please check which status you can reach and inform me soon. We are planning to have our next PM in February/March 92 in Krakow, organized by AEGEE-Krakow in cooperation with AEGEE-Warszawa and Wrocław.

2. Agorá

First of all I hope everybody of you received and invitation from AEGEE-Budapest and registered there with how many people you are coming.

As you know these of you who want to become antennae must pay their membership fees which shouldn't be more as 2% of your average monthly student income. It seems senseless that you transfer your national currency to our ABN or COBA bank account.

We want that you create a special bank account in your town where you let stay your membership fees. On the Agorá we want to arrange with you special contracts that you should use this money for AEGEE development in your town; for a PR campaign for instance. So we do it in Budapest you don't have to bring the money with you. There were some questions about how many people can come as delegates to the Agorá. Every antenna or contactantenna can send at least 3 delegates who must be elected by the own assembly.

Only antennae can vote and you can also send observers who have to pay for their lodging and meals.

The number of votes is depending on how many members you have:

from 1 to 20 members you receive 1 vote

21 to 50	2 votes
51 to 100	3
101 to 150	4
151 to 200	5
201 to 250	6
251 to 350	7 and so on.

3. TEMPUS

Together with this dispatch you'll receive a letter concerning the new TEMPUS programme. I've explained when and how AEGEE can prepare the application for projects concerning TEMPUS. So please send your ideas for projects between September to 31st December in time to us.

We'll prepare the final application the 31st of December 91 concerning projects which take place between the 1st September - 31st December 92. So we need your ideas.

The TEMPUS office is also interested in projects which don't set up only in the capitals of the country, other university towns have a good chance.

For the TEMPUS office is also important that Eastern antennae are acting as direct partners. That means an Eastern antenna is fulfilling itself the application and send this to me.

I integrate a support and confirm letter of the CD of AEGEE-Europe to this and send it in with our final AEGEE application.

Please don't send direct applications to the EC TEMPUS office without contacting me

4. Technical problems

We need for a better communication faster possibilities than the mail. This can be a Fax. So please look in your university where you can receive Faxes and inform me about. Also you should try to find ways of support from your university, please try to inform them about your European activities and find ways of support. I know it's not easy to try it. The mail takes really too long. Also helpful can be for us letters of support from the university and the government - we need these for our TEMPUS application.

5. AEGEE in the former U.S.S.R.

On our CD meeting in Oviedo we decided that in those former republics where taken democratic reforms and held democratic elections can we establish antennae or contactantennae.

That's why AEGEE-Moscow and Riga can reach the antennae status if they have been fulfilled the other criteria.

In 1992 the year of the common market in West Europe AEGEE has to show as an association which is everytime a step forward that we doing big efforts in East Europe. We can show this through European events there in 1992, one step can be the next PM in Krakow. But of course we need more that's why we need your ideas and plans to work in this field.

So please don't hesitate and contact me if you have ideas, questions or problems.

I hope to see you in Budapest.

Content of the Programme

TEMPUS is the acronym for the Trans-Europe Mobility Scheme for University Studies, adopted by the Council of Ministers of the European Communities on 7 May 1990, within a perspective of five years, for an initial pilot phase of three years beginning on 1 July 1990. This Vademecum covers the academic year 1992/1993 for activities related to Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Romania and Yugoslavia.

TEMPUS forms part of the overall programme of Community aid for the economic restructuring of the countries of Central/Eastern Europe. Within this framework, training has been identified as one of the priority areas for cooperation.

Targeted to meet the specific needs of Central/Eastern Europe, the main goals of the TEMPUS scheme are:

- to promote the quality and support the development and renewal of the higher education systems in the countries of Central/Eastern Europe designated as eligible for economic aid by the Council.
- to encourage their growing interaction and cooperation with partners in the European Community, through joint activities and relevant mobility.

With a restricted amount of money TEMPUS supports also students associations, which are trying to integrate East-European student in their association as equal members. You can find this more detailed explained in the TEMPUS-programme under Action 3: Complementary Activities, especially point 3.1 and 3.3.

What can AEGEE do in this field?

In general, we can say, AEGEE has to show an integration of East-European students in our association. We must establish equal antennae in those countries. Of course we did a lot of efforts in this way, but we should go on with that and try to make our activities in this field better known to the EC.

This general development of AEGEE in those countries should be used as a frame. The AEGEE development in a special country can be initiated through congresses, seminars, academies or visits. There must be shown a use for the East European students in their universities.

So, if we are planning an event in the East, we have to express in our application, that we want to use this event for the creation of AEGEE in this country. Every event must be integrated in the general development line of AEGEE in East-European countries and AEGEE can apply for a subvention for those events at the TEMPUS-Office.

Preparation of the application and deadline

AEGEE-Europe is the coordinator of the application. We will collect all the single projects and integrate them in the great development line. Please do not direct your applications to the TEMPUS-Office.

The deadline for the application is the 31.12.91 for projects which will take place from the 1. of September to the 31. of December 1992. So be on time!

The highest available amount is 20.000 ECU, but the average amount per projects awarded in 1991 was 10.000 ECU.

How we do it practically?

First of all we need your ideas for projects in East-Europe which will take place in the second half of 92.

On the Regional Meeting held in Berlin from the 28./29.9.91 was taken the decision about the timetable for the creation of the application.

First we hope to motivate you with this letter to think about possible projects for the academical year 92/93.

We want to talk about this as one of our main points on the EWWG meeting held in Debrecen from the 1.-4. November.

So please present your ideas oral or written in Debrecen (you can send me your proposals). The next and last step will be in Hamburg on the 14/15 December after the Hamburg congress. There we want to collect the single applications and create the general ones for AEGEE.

So in Hamburg we need your concrete facts: description of the project, budget, fixed date. We cannot use then only ideas and proposals for projects, which are very unconcrete.

After Hamburg I will present our provisional application to the responsibilities of the TEMPUS-Office and after their advice I have to work out the final one and to send it before the 31.12.91 to the office.

We need your ideas and if you have questions do not hesitate and contact me. Please be also in time with your application and use the possibility of the above mentioned meetings to take in the creation of our hopefully successful TEMPUS application.

ERASMUS TEAM MEETING BORDEAUX OCT. 12TH 1991

Another meeting of the Erasmus Team took place at the Presidents' Meeting in Bordeaux. I would hereby like to communicate the main points of the meeting since they are crucial for AEGEE in the medium and long term, concerning our work on mobility.

Only six antennae attended the meeting. I would like to stress the need of a good information flow and the participation of all of our antennae in the AEGEE European projects such as our "Guide of European Universities" and our "Evaluation study on Erasmus".

Main points:

1. Guide of European Universities: so far only 27 reports have been sent in to Nikolaus Eberff (Berlin). We need many more study reports written by an Erasmus student at your antenna in order to complete the Guide. This is a good project and it should be kept within AEGEE, but if we cannot fully achieve it, we should perhaps start thinking about opening it to cooperation with other associations. Persons interested in continuing the work will be welcomed.

2. Evaluation study on Erasmus: as you may know AEGEE-Oviedo has been distributing a questionnaire in order to compile a complete study on our actual situation. The input from all antennae is needed so please return your questionnaire to Oviedo as soon as possible. If many antennae cooperate financial support could be asked from the Erasmus Bureau for its publication.

3. Working on Erasmus at a local level: the Erasmus Academy held in Oviedo set a good pattern to follow as far as our activities on a local level are concerned. We, antennae active on Erasmus, could try to stick to an homogeneous pattern (mentorship, lodging, legal advice, excursions, ...) in order to offer an image of coordination to external observers (Commission, Erasmus Bureau, Council, ...).

4. Looking towards the future: "Tempus Academy" as a continuation of the Erasmus Academy may be held next year, probably in Budapest. A yearly event on mobility such as this one will prove to be very useful, both for our internal formation and our external image.

5. Erasmus Bureau short term policy: go ahead and ask the information Dept. of the Bureau for posters, information booklets, vademecums, and Free subscription to the Newsletter edited by the Bureau. They will be willing to give us such an information support.

Looking forward to seeing you all in the Erasmus Congress at Geneva or in the Agorá at Budapest.

ACTIVITY REPORT OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL WORKING GROUP

In the last two years environmental topics have become a constant part of AEGEE's yearly programme. During environmental weeks, environmental congresses, workcamps or many other activities three tasks have turned out to be of great importance for the EnWG:

1. The support of local activities referring to the ecological situation in a European framework.
2. the organization of European environmental projects (Congresses, workcamps, excursions or initiatives) in AEGEE as a forum for communication between people with different experience under different living conditions.
3. the cooperation with organizations dealing with environment outside AEGEE, which are interested in establishing contacts in Europe.

What has occurred since the Agorá in Amsterdam?

Every year the European Environmental Week (EnWeek) is an essential part of the undertakings of the EnWG, by relating lectures, excursions, discussions or other forms of local actions all over Europe to a specific topic. In May events at 20 European universities were coordinated by Mannheim and drew young people's attention to ecological problems of traffic. The "Brenner Project" of Munich, the "Semana Europea del Medio Ambiente" of Oviedo or the EnWeek or Maastricht for example had a more regional or European character, but the creativity of the local organizers enabled us also to consider specific local problems in many other cities.

One result of the EnWeek 1991 was the initiative for a "European Green Travel Card" from Nijmegen, which is now part of our present work. It combines the mobility of young people with environmental education by using public transports. Apart from the initiative, workcamps are a part of our second task. They are directed at gathering experience in nature conservation by combining work in a nature reserve with opportunities to watch the flora and fauna of non familiar regions. An example for this concept was the workcamp "Ecological Action and Reflection" at Lake Como in Italy, organized by AEGEE Milano in May 1991. 20 Participants worked on fences, paths on brokes and observed the life of birds. An interesting leisure programme included trips to Milano or to the mountains. The workcamp of Crau did not take place, because of the low participation.

It is much easier to understand practical problems of environmental protection, if you see them on the spot. As the 2nd European Environmental Congress will take place in Latvia in 1992, an excursion of the EnWG led to Riga. We planned to get familiar with the ecological problems of Latvia and to prepare the congress with our friends from the Environmental Protection Club of Latvia (VAK). It was the mid of August, so soon our

travel was characterized by political questions of freedom and independence. The failure of the military revolt in the USSR resulted in the independence of the Baltic States. We are looking forward to meet a delegation from the VAK in Münster soon and to make up a closer contact to the Latvian environment at the congress.

At the same time this project of Riga reflects the third main task of the EnWG - the cooperation with other organizations. The Environmental Protection Club of Latvia is a strong partner for this project, like the international Discussion Club of Moscow has been and will be in a few other conferences and workcamps with the support of AEGEE-Moscow. Beside these regular contacts the EnWG has supported the activities of other non-political environmental organizations with PR work like the workcamp of the Węgorzewo Environmental Protection Club in Poland or the Environmental Congress of the Hungarian Students associations in September. Many media contacts during the European Environmental Congress in Münster or the Environmental Week resulted in more than 30 external inquiries and new demands for cooperation. Furthermore the work of the EnWG was presented to the environmental department of the European Commission in Brussels and to the City of Bremen in Germany.

What will occur in the EnWG in the future? In this Newsletter you will find the answer in the Minutes of our last meeting in Bordeaux. MINUTES OF THE ENWG MEETING IN BORDEAUX IN OCTOBER 11/12

At the Presidents' Meeting in Bordeaux, the Environmental Working Group met for the third time this year. While we started with a look back on the last month, you will find this part of our meeting in the activity report.

1. FUTURE PROJECTS

-ENWEEK 1992 - The topic of EnWeek from 27th to 30th of April will be "Environment and Consciousness". The coordination is taken by AEGEE Amsterdam and AEGEE Nijmegen. A weekend seminar 17th-19th of January will give local organizers the opportunity to exchange ideas or find partners for regional events. As the number of participating antennae can differ very strongly, the coordinators cannot assume any financial obligations, but will provide you with PR-Material, which might be a main source of cost.

-ENVIRONMENTAL CONGRESS IN RIGA - At the 2nd European Environmental Congress near Riga from the 21st to the 26th of April 1992, we will focus on the environmental problems of Latvia as an example for the Baltic states. It includes the

situation of the Baltic Sea just as the environmental relations between East and West in a European framework. The contact with our partners from the Environmental Protection Club of Latvia is held by AEGEE-Münster.

-INITIATIVE EUROPEAN GREEN TRAVEL CARD (EGTC) - After the good experience with free public transport as a part of the students' grant in the Netherlands, AEGEE Nijmegen has started to "export" the idea. First steps can be made on a local or regional level, but the final aim is to offer a card on a European level. At the moment the situation of public transport in the different countries is examined. All information on services and fares are welcome.

-BOOKLET ON EUROPEAN ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY - AEGEE Maastricht is preparing a booklet which will explain the environmental policy of the European Community to students.

-ACADEMY IN BRUSSELS - At the moment we are in negotiations with the European Commission about an academy on their environmental policy, which have not been completed yet.

-WORKCAMPS - They have been useful projects to raise the understanding of the natural system. They should be part of our 1992 activities. The timing of these projects should be improved to ensure a big number of participants. Furthermore, antennae might link language courses at the Summer University with environmental matters as it will be done by Moscow this winter.

-LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL WORKING GROUPS - The cooperation with the environmental working groups in the antennae will be an important task of our work in the near future. The coordination is done by Michèle in Amsterdam.

2. INTERNALS

-FOUNDATION - Caused by difficulties in financial affairs with a former CD, the assembly of the EnWG in Münster in April had decided to prepare the setting up of a foundation. Due to the improvement of the financial situation of AEGEE-Europe and to juridical questions the necessity for a foundation does not exist any longer. Therefore the assembly agreed on canceling the setting up of a foundation.

-PR - The report of the EnWeek 1991 will describe the work of the EnWG in general. With this brochure the necessary PR material for all environmental projects in AEGEE in the near future will be available.

COMMENTS TO THE PROFIT AND LOSS

Three academies were awarded with a grant from the Council of Europe of 50.000 FF. 80% has been received so far. Many people have been looking forward to the TEAM '90 profit which will be divided when the final part arrives. Some additional membership fees for the Budapest Agora have been sent in. During the Agora in Amsterdam some antennae paid their dues which could not be included in the, then presented, financial report. Total income amounts up to nearly 18.000 ECU.

However, there were also some expenditures like a debt pay-off towards AEGEE-Saarbrücken and a part of the Council of Europe subvention for AEGEE-Oviedo's great Erasmus Academy. Some urgent expenses relating to TEAM '91 have been made as well as hopefully the last payment related to EGEE VI in Paris 1990. Some money has been transferred to former CD members.

Current CD-expenditure is divided in three parts: CD Meeting travel refers to costs made by CD members to come to CD Meetings. CD-Overhead consists of cost incurred by the President, the Treasurer and the Secretary-General. Further CD expenses are related to the different fields of action within the CD. Two more remarks to this: Erasmus expenses consists of two persons working in this field. Keep in mind that part of these total CD costs were made before the period mentioned in this report. Therefore 6.000 ECU were reserved in the last balance sheet so the exact amount of cost is stated in this period.

The new formed Audit Commission spent about 400 ECU so far, while the total costs related to the Address book amount up to 1.132 ECU. Transaction costs incurred are more than 200 ECU; if you sent a cheque as a membership fee payment you will get voting rights equal to after-transaction value.

As you can see the result is not as nice as we all would like to see, but keep in mind that the last period presented a positive result of more than 5.000 ECU.

COMMENTS TO THE BALANCE

AEGEE-Europe's liquidity position will not be as dramatic as it used to be. Many debtors assure some income for the next few months. Money kept in the bank accounts and in cash amount up to some 2.600 ECU which will do for CD-reimbursements and the Agora in Budapest. At the end of November Team '90 will transfer the last part of the profit which can then be divided between the applying antennae. 20% of the Council of Europe subvention will be transferred after delivery of a financial report. The general subvention for 1991 will hopefully arrive in December. Again the German ministry for education grants some money for projects set up by German antennae. AEGEE-Annecey borrowed some money which will be paid back soon. An estimation for membership fees to arrive for the Budapest Agora is set to DM 1.000,-. Some CD members received some money for which bills were sent, but were not included yet in the bookkeeping.

Liabilities, however, still exist and even in quite large amounts, like some debts towards antennae. The time-span of these debts differs for some antennae. Debts towards external organizations like the University of Paris, the phone company and Gefira still exist, but have not been claimed for some time. However, it is too early to consider them as booked-off. Some old and current CD-members have approved debts, but have not been paid yet. Due to a mistake in a financial report some money has to be paid back to the German Ministry. The rest will be divided between the applying German antennae. Some claimed debts are reserved until there is more clearness about the amounts claimed.

The whole story leads to an own capital of -2.621,52.

CONCLUSIONS

Due to the great success of TEAM '90 and strict rules for reimbursements AEGEE-Europe has been able to improve its financial situation. When some old debts can be booked-off, the situation can be called healthy. I sincerely hope that the next CD can deal with this situation in a "healthy way". Europe "A chance for Reform"

"Europe 1992" and "Perestroika" are shorthand for some of the fundamental changes our societies are undergoing and, with it, the international frame work of the postwar period. Change, this time, does not seem to come "big steps forward" or by sudden eruptions. It seems to come as part of an ongoing process - never as new as revolutionaries say and never as old as conservatives pretend. Do we have, at this juncture of European History, the unique opportunity of managing a peaceful transition, a controlled adjustment of our political structures to the needs of the modern world? Do we have a chance for reform in East and West?

Europe is on the move. In the East we have seen a revolution in which a new educated middleclass is breaking the shackles of an incompetent and obscurantist ancient regime, and seeking to establish a new order based upon intelligent analyses, reasoned discussion, and cooperation with the neighbours. Their hopes for reform are fixed on Europe. In a moving joint appeal by an Englishman, a Czech and a Hungarian this summer I read: "Poland and Hungary wish to return to Europe, to the west, in their economies and politics and much as in their cultural life. But is Europe, is the West, ready to receive them?"

The people of Eastern Europe ought to know, however, -and I think they do- that they shall not return to an old-fashioned Europe, that they are not going to join, as new player, a concert of independent sovereign nation states. Europe today is unthinkable without the European Community which, in the course of 40 years since the Schuman-Plan, has changed profoundly and irrevocably the political landscape of our continent. Confronted with the hopes and expectations of Eastern European nations, we might be well advised to take a fresh look at the political structures which are slowly emerging in Western Europe:

We have managed to build up a fairly pluralistic political structure - a far cry both from a European superstate and from a concert of fully sovereign nation states. The guiding principle of our textbooks on constitutional law and international law, the monopoly of power of a nation state, disguised by various theories of sovereignty, proved to be too dangerous (to wit two world wars). It also proved to be exceedingly inefficient, because economic and technological developments of our time defy the old concept of "national economy". Slowly but steadily, a very pluralistic structure of government and administration has grown up within the European Community, extremely untidy and

difficult to manage, full of internal contradictions but, apparently, better adapted to the needs of modern society than what we have known before and what we see around us.

There is the need to harmonize in order to make the internal market function. There is the need to preserve the diversity of political cultures and traditions. There is also a distinct tendency for European regions to reassert their cultural and even political identity.

We are ourselves reluctant to call this process of European integration a reform of our political structure, for good reasons, we do not want to bid farewell too soon and too abruptly to old structures nor do we know what is going to emerge. Future historians, however, might do so and call the second half of our century the "Age of European reform".

We are slowly moving to a consensus that the European Community -the motor of European integration- can only work with a free internal market, some kind of economic and monetary union, some kind of common foreign policy and some kind of effective democratic control. But we are far from agreeing on a precise form of the "finalite politique" of our joint efforts. Europe, as it stands today, remains disappointing for federalists and anathema to the few remaining die-hard nationalists. But the Community has put Europe on the map of the world again. For other European democracies, the EFTA countries, there is the economic and political need to forge closer links with the Community. The newly created "European Economic Area" is the first consequence. For Eastern European states the Community is a model for the political and economic reform.

This "European experiment" will have to remain an open-ended process of change and reform. I would like to advance two important reasons for openness:

Firstly, we have started this process of reforming our political structures in the name of Europe. If the historical process of reform in Eastern Europe means a "return to Europe", we must not only encourage and actively help these reforms to succeed, we must also open the door to the future. Not only food is needed and economic cooperation. We need political vision. It is a question of the legitimacy of our European endeavours that we keep the Community open to those Europeans willing and able to join it. While lowering the threshold to membership on essential points we should not make it higher than really necessary. Political change in Eastern Europe means, as I read these days in a German newspaper, "das Reden von Europa ist von Europa eingeholt worden" (the reality of Europe has caught up with our talk on Europe).

Secondly, looking at the evolution of modern society and the modern world, we cannot possibly know which precise form of political organization would be the adequate structure for Europe in the twenty-first century, we know already that Europe-building means a farewell to the model of the fully sovereign national state. There are good reasons for not being too eager to replace that model by too strict a concept of a future European political organization. We hear from experts on the emerging "communication society" that the modern developments of society and worldwide cooperation might require much more subtle and flexible forms of government and administration that we have known so far.

The historical calling of the Community may be to pioneer new forms of political organization, beyond the model of the nation state, and better adapted to the needs of modern society and a model world order. There are good reasons to assume that Europe-building will remain an open-ended process of political reform which far-sighted and European-minded citizens must try to steer.

If national structures and traditions do not, on the whole, provide the necessary European incentives, it is more important that young people become experienced Europeans. Here too we have to conclude "No Europe without Europeans".

Slowly but steadily we see a new type of governmental and administrative structures emerge within the European Community. Their evolution does not follow a comprehensive blueprint which, I think, is for the good. For the only blueprint we have so far is that of the traditional nation state with its centralized bureaucratic administration which is obviously not capable of responding adequately to the challenges of the modern world. Let us, instead make full use of the change for reforming our political structures which the present situation in Europe provides.

What is happening in the Eastern part of our continent reminds us of a basic truth which, at least in theory, we have learnt to take for granted in our societies: namely that state and administrations are there to serve the citizens and not the other way around.

The secret of a free society remains the recognition of a free citizen. Speaking about his fellow countrymen, Count Egmont in Goethe's "Trauerspiel" gives a good definition of European citizens:

"Ich kenne meine Landsleute. Schwer ist's, ihr Zutraun zu verdienen leicht, zu erhalten... Zu drücken sind sie, nicht zu unterdrücken"
